Rory McIlroy (Winner/-21)

27th career PGA TOUR title

- Earns his 27th career PGA TOUR title in his 258th start at the age of 35 years, 8 months, 29 days
- Moves to 22nd on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list, breaking a tie with Henry Picard (26 wins)
- Third time winning in his season debut on TOUR (2021 THE CJ CUP, 2022 THE CJ CUP, 2025 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Second win in a Signature Event (2024 Truist Championship)
- Eighth consecutive season with a win on the PGA TOUR
- 14th time winning an individual stroke-play event on TOUR after entering the final round at least one shot behind the 54hole leader/co-leaders (entered final round one shot behind 54-hole leader Sepp Straka)
- Earns 700 FedExCup points and moves to No. 3 in the 2025 FedExCup standings
- World No. 3 and three-time FedExCup champion (2016, 2019, 2022)

Win at AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am

- Played the final nine holes 5-under par with three birdies (Nos. 10, 12, 15) and one eagle (par-5 No. 14)
- Led the field this week in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (5.970) and Driving Distance (336.7)
- 21-under marks the second-lowest score relative to par by a winner at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since 1983 (22under/Brandt Snedeker/2015)
- Second TOUR victory in California (2015 World Golf Championships-Cadillac Match Play at TPC Harding Park)
- Becomes sixth international winner of the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, joining Justin Rose (England/2023), Nick Taylor (Canada/2020), Vijay Singh (Fiji/2004), Brett Ogle (Australia/1993) and Bruce Crampton (Australia/1965)
- Aced the par-3 15th at Spyglass Hill in the first round; becomes the first player on TOUR since Justin Rose (2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am) to record an ace and go on to win the event

Additional Player Notes

- Shane Lowry (2nd/-19) played the final eight holes 5-under par and earns fourth career runner-up finish on TOUR
- Lucas Glover (T3/-18) claims his second top-10 finish in 11 career starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T7/2019)
- 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion Justin Rose (T3/-18) records his third top-10 finish in his sixth career start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T6/2016, Won/2023, T3/2025)
- 36- and 54-hole leader **Sepp Straka** (T7/-16) clinches his second top-10 finish in his fourth start of the season to move to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- In his season debut, World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T9/-15) records his second straight top-10 in the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T6/2024)
- Adam Scott (T22/-10) posts the low round of the day, a bogey-free 64, tied for his lowest 18-hole score in 17 career rounds at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (64/2010/R3)
