Matt McCarty

- Won the 2024 Bank of Utah Championship in his third career PGA TOUR start and second as a TOUR member
- With his victory, became the second player to win on the PGA TOUR in the same season after earning the Korn Ferry Tour's Three-Victory Promotion (Jason Gore/2005 84 Lumber Classic)
- In 25 starts this season, owns nine top-25 finishes and two top-10s (T4/RBC Canadian Open, T8/Wyndham Championship)
- Enters the week No. 84 in the FedExCup Fall standings
- Carded a career-low 60 in the final round of his most recent start at the Baycurrent Classic (finished T14)

Patrick Fishburn

- Ogden, Utah native played four seasons collegiately at BYU (2011-12 season, 2015-18 seasons)
- Making his second career start in the Bank of Utah Championship after missing the cut in 2024
- Second-year PGA TOUR member enters the week No. 98 in the FedExCup Fall standings; needs to finish inside the top 100
 of the FedExCup Fall standings through The RSM Classic to retain exempt status for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- In 26 starts this season, has four top-10 finishes (T5/Valero Texas Open, T6/Sony Open in Hawaii, T6/ISCO Championship, T8/Wyndham Championship)
- Won the 2016 Utah Amateur Championship at Alpine Country Club in Highland as well as the 2017 Utah Open at Riverside Country Club in Provo

Zac Blair

- St. George, Utah resident who attended Fremont High School in Plain City, Utah where he was a four-time all-state honoree
- Played four seasons collegiately at BYU (2009-13), earning four individual titles and 2012 Third-Team All-America honors
- In 221 career starts on TOUR, best finish is a pair of T2s (2023 Travelers Championship, 2024 ISCO Championship)
- Playing with conditional status in 2025, sits No. 172 in the FedExCup Fall standings after one top-25 in 17 starts (T18/Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Of the nine players with Utah ties in last year's Bank of Utah Championship, Blair was the lone player to make the cut, eventually finishing 66th

Preston Summerhays

- Sponsor exemption making his 11th career start on TOUR and first in the Bank of Utah Championship; has two starts on TOUR this season since turning professional (MC/U.S. Open, MC/John Deere Classic)
- Two-time winner of the Utah Amateur (2018, 2019); his 2018 title came when he was just 15 years old, making him the youngest winner in the event's history
- Played four seasons at Arizona State University (2021-25) where he earned four individual victories and garnered two All-America honors, including a first-team laurel in 2023

• Finished his senior season as the No. 7-ranked player in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2025, earning Korn Ferry Tour membership for the remainder of the 2025 season (two top-10 finishes in 11 starts; 109th on Korn Ferry Tour Points List)

Bank of Utah Championship notes

- Five of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking are in the field: **Alex Noren** (No. 17), **Maverick McNealy** (No. 19), **Kurt Kitayama** (No. 36), **Billy Horschel** (No. 38), **Jason Day** (No. 42)
- Seven players in the field have won a tournament on TOUR this season: Steven Fisk (Sanderson Farms Championship), Ryan Gerard (Barracuda Championship), Joe Highsmith (Cognizant Classic), Kurt Kitayama (3M Open), William Mouw (ISCO Championship), Aldrich Potgieter (Rocket Classic), Karl Vilips (Puerto Rico Open)
- One player in the field competed at last month's TOUR Championship: Maverick McNealy
- Four 2024 FedExCup Fall winners qualified for the 2025 FedExCup Playoffs (bold= in the field): Kevin Yu/Sanderson Farms
 Championship, J.T. Poston/Shriners Children's Open, Nico Echavarria/Baycurrent Classic, Maverick McNealy/The RSM
 Classic
- Eight players in the field have ties to Utah, including all four unrestricted sponsor exemptions:
 - Kihei Akina Freshman at BYU from Alpine, Utah; missed cut at 2024 Bank of Utah Championship in TOUR debut;
 originally from Kahuku, Hawaii; attended Lone Peak High School where he was a four-time all-state selection
 - Connor Howe Ogden, Utah native; began college career at Weber State University before transferring to the University of Utah; making his first career PGA TOUR start since turning professional in 2023 (34 total starts across the Korn Ferry Tour and PGA TOUR Americas)
 - o David Liechty Freshman at Utah Tech University in St. George, Utah; native of Layton, Utah
 - Preston Summerhays Two-time Utah Amateur champion (2018, 2019) who was born in Farmington, Utah;
 ranked No. 7 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2025
- Adam Svensson holds the 18-hole scoring record at the Bank of Utah Championship with a first-round 60 in 2024
- Sponsor exemption Michael Brennan claimed the Fortinet Cup title on PGA TOUR Americas after claiming three victories during the 2025 season, earning him exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2026; Wake Forest product from Leesburg, Virginia will make his third career PGA TOUR start and first since turning professional in 2024

PGA TOUR season notes

- The 2025 Bank of Utah Championship is the fourth event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2026) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
- The Aon Next 10 is an eligibility pathway that awards access into Signature Events (outside of The Sentry), recognizing the top 10 players, not otherwise exempt, from the FedExCup standings; Nos. 51-60 in the final FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will serve as the Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
- There are 14 players in the field who rank between Nos. 91-110 in the standings and are not exempt on TOUR beyond 2025: Rico Hoey (No. 91), Matt Wallace (No. 93), Beau Hossler (No. 95), Patrick Fishburn (No. 98), David Lipsky (No. 99), Isaiah Salinda (No. 101), Joel Dahmen (No. 103), Max McGreevy (No. 104), Victor Perez (No. 105), Sam Ryder (No. 106), Andrew Putnam (No. 107), Lanto Griffin (No. 108), Lee Hodges (No. 109), Taylor Moore (No. 110)
