COMPLETED Second-Round Notes – Saturday, October 25, 2025

Suspension summary: The second round was suspended due to darkness at 6:47 p.m. MT with 46 players yet to complete their round. The second round resumed at 8:02 a.m. Saturday and was completed at 10:10 a.m.

36-hole cut: 67 professionals at 2-under 140 from a field of 130 professionals and two amateurs.

Weather: Friday: Sunny. High of 75. Variable wind 3-8 mph. Saturday: Mostly sunny with morning temperatures in the upper 40s.

Michael Brennan (T1/-10)

- Making his third career PGA TOUR start and first as a professional, posts 67-65 to take a share of the 36-hole lead; previous PGA TOUR starts as an amateur: 2022 Genesis Invitational (MC), 2023 U.S. Open (MC)
- Leading the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (3.731) through two rounds
- Won three times on PGA TOUR Americas in 2025 and finished No. 1 in the 2025 Fortinet Cup standings to earn fully exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2026; is also exempt into Final Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry in December
- Posted 12 top-10s in 16 starts on PGA TOUR Americas in 2025, with his three victories coming in a span of four starts in August and September
- Finished No. 12 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking to earn membership on PGA TOUR Americas for the 2024 season; earned eight individual victories in four seasons at Wake Forest, including back-to-back victories at the ACC Championships in 2023 and 2024
- Would become the fifth player since 1970 to win his first PGA TOUR title in their third career start and first since Matt McCarty at the 2024 Bank of Utah Championship
- Last sponsor exemption to win on TOUR: Nick Dunlap (2024 American Express)

David Ford (T1/-10)

- After making double bogey at the par-4 13th to resume his second round Saturday morning, birdies four of his final fives holes for 65 to take a share of the 36-hole lead in his 13th career PGA TOUR start
- Leads the field with 15 birdies through two rounds
- Finished No. 1 in the 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking to earn PGA TOUR membership for the remainder of the 2025 season as well as the 2026 season
- In nine starts since turning professional and joining the TOUR in May, has two made cuts, with a T44 in his most recent start at the Sanderson Farms Championship his best finish
- In four seasons at the University of North Carolina, earned seven collegiate victories including five as a senior
- Winner of the 2025 Fred Haskins Award and 2025 Jack Nicklaus Award two of the three collegiate national player of the year awards; two-time ACC Player of the Year (2023 and 2025)

Miscellaneous Notes

- PGA TOUR rookie **Jackson Suber** (T3/-9) birdies five of his final six holes and ranks second in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.009); enters the week No. 127 in the FedExCup Fall standings with three top-10s in 23 starts this season, highlighted by a pair of T6 finishes at the Sony Open in Hawaii and Rocket Classic
- Pierceson Coody (T3/-9) posts bogey-free 64 for the lowest score in round two, his low 18-hole score on TOUR this season; playing with conditional status on TOUR in 2025, finished No. 12 in the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour points list to regain his TOUR card in 2026
- Justin Lower (T3/-9) eagles the par-5 seventh hole for the second consecutive day en route to a 67; enters the week No. 129 in the FedExCup Fall standings with two top-10 finishes in 25 starts this season (T3/The American Express, T8/Zurich Classic of New Orleans)
- Defending champion **Matt McCarty** (T6/-8) posts 7-under 28 on the back nine, his second nine-hole score of 29 or better in his last three rounds on TOUR (2025 Baycurrent Classic/R4/29)
- Two of the eight players in this week's field with ties to Utah made the cut: Connor Howe (T6/-8) and Zac Blair (T25/-5)
- Aldrich Potgieter WD prior to the second round (illness)
- Gordon Sargent, Camilo Villegas and Emiliano Grillo WD during the second round

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The 2025 Bank of Utah Championship is the fourth event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2026) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
- The Aon Next 10 is an eligibility pathway that awards access into Signature Events (outside of The Sentry), recognizing the top 10 players, not otherwise exempt, from the FedExCup standings; Nos. 51-60 in the final FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will serve as the Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
