Michael Brennan (Winner/-22)

- Wins his first PGA TOUR title in his third career start and first as a professional at the age of 23 years, 8 months, 17 days
- With the victory, becomes eligible to take up PGA TOUR membership, which includes exempt status through 2027 and exemptions into THE PLAYERS Championship, RBC Heritage and PGA Championship in 2026
- Should he take membership, would receive 500 FedExCup points and move to No. 95 in the FedExCup Fall standings
- 14th first-time winner this season and the first sponsor exemption to win on TOUR since Nick Dunlap (2024 American Express)
- Becomes the seventh player since 1970 to win his first PGA TOUR title within his first three career starts; fifth player to win his first title in his third career start and first since Matt McCarty at the 2024 Bank of Utah Championship

- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (7.616)
- Had two PGA TOUR starts as an amateur prior to this week: 2022 Genesis Invitational (MC), 2023 U.S. Open (MC)
- Won three times on PGA TOUR Americas in 2025 and finished No. 1 in the 2025 Fortinet Cup standings to earn fully exempt status on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2026; posted 12 top-10s in 16 starts on PGA TOUR Americas in 2025, with his three victories coming in a span of four starts in August and September
- Finished No. 12 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking to earn membership on PGA TOUR Americas for the 2024 season;
 earned eight individual victories in four seasons at Wake Forest, including back-to-back victories at the ACC Championships in 2023 and 2024
- Projected to move from No. 111 to No. 43 in the Official World Golf Ranking; was No. 681 to end the 2024 calendar year

Miscellaneous Notes

- Second-year member Rico Hoey (2nd/-18) collects his second career runner-up finish (T2/2024 ISCO Championship) in his 58th career start on TOUR; moves to No. 61 in the FedExCup Fall standings after finishing inside the top 10 in three of the four events in the FedExCup Fall (T9/Procore Championship, T4/Baycurrent Classic)
- Defending champion **Matt McCarty** (T3/-16) posts the second-best result by a defending champion on TOUR this season (Scottie Scheffler/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday/Won)
- Seeking his first TOUR title in his 99th career start, **Thorbjørn Olesen** (T3/-16), collects his best finish of the season (previous: T5/Valero Texas Open) and moves inside the top 100 in the FedExCup Fall standings from No. 116 to No. 97
- 2025 PGA TOUR University No. 1 **David Ford** (T3/-16) collects his first career top-10 finish on TOUR; entered the week with two made cuts in nine starts since joining the TOUR as a member in May
- Ben Silverman (T3/-16) posts his career-best finish on TOUR in his 111th start (previous: T4/2024 Procore Championship)
- Two players with ties to Utah who made the cut: Zac Blair (T20/-12) and Connor Howe (T56/-5)

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The Bank of Utah Championship was the fourth event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season.
- The top 100 players in the FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will be exempt into all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026 while Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status on TOUR.
