points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole, with the goal of achieving the highest overall number of
points

Double bogey or worse: -3 points

Ryan Gerard (Winner/+47)

- Earns first PGA TOUR title in his 47th career start at the age of 25 years, 11 months, 18 days
- Previous best finish on TOUR: 2nd/2025 Valero Texas Open
- Becomes the 11th first-time winner on TOUR this season (most recent: William Mouw/ISCO Championship)
- Becomes the eighth player since 2012 to earn their first PGA TOUR title at the Barracuda Championship
- Converts first career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR
- First player since Chez Reavie (2022) to win the Barracuda Championship after holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead
- Earns 300 FedExCup points and moves from No. 42 to No. 28 in the FedExCup standings
- Win marks second top-five at the Barracuda Championship (5th/2023, Won/2025)
- Records fourth top-10 of the season (9th/Texas Children's Houston Open, 2nd/Valero Texas Open, T8/PGA Championship)

Additional notes:

- 2021 Barracuda Championship winner **Erik van Rooyen** (2nd/+42) collects his third career runner-up finish on TOUR and second this season (T2/2024 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, 2nd/2025 THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
 - Was in search of his third career PGA TOUR title in his 135th start
 - Earns third top-10 in as many starts at the Barracuda Championship (Won/2021, T6/2023, 2nd/2025)
 - Moves from No. 81 to No. 62 in the FedExCup standings; following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will earn a spot in the FedExCup Playoffs
- Making his fifth PGA TOUR start and second at the Barracuda Championship, DP World Tour member Todd
 Clements (3rd/+39) finishes solo third
- Beau Hossler (T4/+37) records 17 points in the final round to secure his first top-10 finish of the season
- 54-hole co-leader Rico Hoey (T8/+34) earns second top-10 of the season (T7/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
