Max Greyserman (1st/-12)

- Holds second career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (4th/2024 World Wide Technology Championship) following bogey-free 8-under 63
- Posts 130 following the first two rounds, which marks one-shy of his career-low 36-hole score on TOUR (129/2024 Wyndham Championship)
- Four-stroke lead marks largest 36-hole lead in tournament history (previous: 2 strokes/twice: Nico Echavarria/2024; Tiger Woods/2019)
- Seeks maiden TOUR victory following four career runner-up finishes in 53 starts (2nd/2024 3M Open; 2nd/2024 Wyndham Championship; T2/2024 Baycurrent Classic; P2/2025 Rocket Classic)
- With a victory, would become first player since Robert MacIntyre (2023, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open) to finish runner-up and win the same tournament the next year
- Enters the week No. 58 in the FedExCup Fall Standings

Miscellaneous Notes

- In his second tournament appearance, **Alex Smalley** (T2/-8) records 6-under 65 for his best score in six rounds at the event; seeks first career TOUR title in 124 starts (best finishes on TOUR: T2/2023 John Deere Classic, T2/2022 Corales Puntacana Championship)
- World No. 4 **Xander Schauffele** (T2/-8) cards a bogey-free 63 in the second round; 134 equals his low-36 hole score on TOUR this season (Genesis Scottish Open/T8)
- 12-time DP World Tour winner, including two this season (Betfred British Masters hosted by Sir Nick Faldo, BMW PGA Championship) **Alex Noren** (T2/-8) cards 6-under 65 to sit four strokes back from the lead; owns three runner-up finishes in 192 career starts on TOUR (most recent: 2nd/2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- Defending champion **Nico Echavarria** (T5/-7) cards 6-under 65 to sit five shots behind the leader; seeks to become the first player to successfully defend at the Baycurrent Classic and first multiple winner of the event
- In his 20th start of the season, **Sahith Theegala** (T5/-7) sits five shots behind the leader following a 4-under 67; has played 47 events since first TOUR victory at the 2023 Procore Championship
- Following a 4-over 75, **Keith Mitchell** (T12/-5) records a 9-under 62 in the second round, one-stroke shy of his career-low round on TOUR (61/R1/2025 Truist Championship)
- **Kazuki Higa** (T9/-7), one of 17 players from Japan in the field, cards a 28 on the front nine to tie the low front-9 score in tournament history (Mark Hubbard/R1/2024, John Huh/R2/2022); matches low-9 score on TOUR this season (Kurt Kitayama/R3/2025 3M Open, Brendan Valdes/R1/2025 3M Open, Jesper Svensson/R3/Texas Children's Houston Open)
