Max Greyserman (T1/-12)

- Seeks first PGA TOUR title in his 54th start; age on Sunday: 30 years, 4 months, 12 days
- Holds four runner-up finishes on TOUR (most recent: 2025 Rocket Classic)
- Holds second career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2nd/2024 Wyndham Championship) following an even-par 71
- With a win, would become first player since Robert MacIntyre (2023, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open) to finish runner-up and win the same tournament the next year
- With a win, would become the 15th first-time winner on TOUR this season and would become the first player to make the Baycurrent Classic his first PGA TOUR victory
- Enters the week No. 58 in the FedExCup Fall Standings and is currently projected No. 51 with a win
- Making his second start at the Baycurrent Classic (T2/2024)
- Has two top-10 finishes in 26 starts this season (T7/The American Express, PT2/Rocket Classic)

Xander Schauffele (T1/-12)

- Seeks 10th PGA TOUR title in his 200th start (most recent: 2024 Open Championship); age on Sunday: 31 years, 11 months, 18 days
- 201 marks his low 54-hole score on TOUR this season (previous this season: 205/three times: T11/Truist Championship; T8/Genesis Scottish Open; T22/ FedEx St. Jude Championship); career best low 54-hole score is 193 (Won/2022 Travelers Championship)
- Making his seventh consecutive start at Baycurrent Classic with two top-10s (T10/2019, T9/2022)
- Has three top-10 finishes in 16 starts this season (T8/Masters Tournament, T8/Genesis Scottish Open, T7/The Open Championship)
- Highest-ranked player in the field at No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Holds 10th career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 3-for-9 to date converting to victory

- Making first start on TOUR since the BMW Championship (T28)
- Holds the most consecutive cuts made on TOUR with 71 (next: Scottie Scheffler/64)
- Won the gold medal in the 2021 Olympic Games in Tokyo, where his maternal grandparents reside; his mother also grew up in Japan

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Michael Thorbjornsen** (T3/-9) sits three shots behind the leaders; seeking maiden victory on TOUR, Thorbjornsen would become the 15th first-time winner on TOUR this season (best finish: runner-up/twice: T2/2025 Corales Puntacana Championship; T2/2024 John Deere Classic)
- **Byeong Hun An** (T3/-9) seeks first TOUR victory; holds five runner-up finishes in 228 starts (most recent: PT2/2024 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- In his 106th start on TOUR, **Garrick Higgo** (T3/-9) seeks his third victory on TOUR (2025 Corales Puntacana Championship; 2021 Palmetto Championship at Congaree)
- South Korea's **Si Woo Kim** (T3/-9) seeks fifth career victory on TOUR and first since the 2023 Sony Open in Hawaii; with a victory, would become the third international player to win the Baycurrent Classic (2024/Nico Echavarria; 2021/Hideki Matsuyama)
- Defending champion **Nico Echavarria** (T3/-9) cards 2-under 69 to sit three shots behind the leader; seeks to become the first player to successfully defend at the Baycurrent Classic and first multiple winner of the event
- **Ren Yonezawa** (T10/-7), one of 17 players from Japan in the field, cards a 6-under 65 for the low round of the day; 65 marks his career best low-round on TOUR (previous best: 66/R2/2024 Baycurrent Classic)
