Xander Schauffele (Winner/-19)

10th career PGA TOUR title in 200th start

- Earns 10th PGA TOUR victory in his 200th start at age of 31 years, 11 months, 18 days
- Becomes the first player since Dustin Johnson (2016 BMW Championship) to win in 200th PGA TOUR start
- **PGA TOUR wins (10):** 2017 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, 2017 TOUR Championship, 2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2019 The Sentry, 2022 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2022 Travelers Championship, 2022 Genesis Scottish Open, 2024 PGA Championship, 2024 Open Championship, 2025 Baycurrent Classic
- Becomes 119th player in PGA TOUR history to reach 10 wins; moves to T109 on the all-time PGA TOUR wins list

With the win at the Baycurrent Classic

- Highest-ranked player in the field moves from No. 4 to No. 3 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Becomes 21st third-round leader/co-leader to win on TOUR in 40 events this season
- Improves 4-for-10 converting 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory on TOUR

- Also held the third-round lead/co-lead at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics where he won the gold medal
- Holds the most consecutive cuts made on TOUR with 72 (since 2022 Masters)
- Win comes in his seventh consecutive start at Baycurrent Classic, with three top-10s (T10/2019, T9/2022, Won/2025)
- Fourth top-10 finish in 16 starts this season (T8/Masters Tournament, T8/Genesis Scottish Open, T7/The Open Championship, Won/Baycurrent Classic)
- Won the gold medal in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, where his maternal grandparents reside; his mother also grew up in Japan

Miscellaneous Notes

- 54-hole co-leader **Max Greyserman** (2nd/-18) records fifth career runner-up finish on TOUR, including second at the Baycurrent Classic (2024) and moves to No. 51 in the FedExCup Fall standings after entering the week at No. 58; was seeking first PGA TOUR win and to become first player since Robert MacIntyre (2023, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open) to finish runner-up and win the same tournament the next year
- Making his Baycurrent Classic debut, **Michael Thorbjornsen** (3rd/-16) cards a final round 7-under 64 for his second-best finish of the season (T2/Corales Puntacana Championship)
- **Matt McCarty** (T14/-10) records his career low-round score on TOUR with a final-round 11-under 60 (previous best: 62/R1/2024 Bank of Utah Championship/Won); 60 marks low 18-hole score in Baycurrent Classic history (previous: 61; Richy Werenski/R2/2020, John Huh/R2/2022)
- Making his 50th PGA TOUR start, **Takumi Kanaya** (T4/-14) records best finish among the 17 Japanese players in the field; 2021 Baycurrent Classic winner **Hideki Matsuyama** finished at T20

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The 2025 Baycurrent Classic is the third of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2026 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
 - One player moved in or fell out of Nos. 51-60: **Garrick Higgo** (T4; from No. 62 to No. 57)
- The Top 100 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status on TOUR
 - Zero players moved in or fell out of the Top 100
