Robert MacIntyre (1st/-16)

- Holes a final-hole birdie putt from 41 feet, 3 inches to card a 2-under 68 and set his career low 54-hole score on TOUR (previous: 195/2024 Genesis Scottish Open/Won) and one stroke shy of the tournament-record 193
- Marks his second 54-hole lead/co-lead in stroke-play events on TOUR (2024 RBC Canadian Open/Won)
- Would become the 20th third-round leader/co-leader to go on and win this season in 36 stroke-play events
- Would become the second lefthander to win a FedExCup Playoffs event (Phil Mickelson) and fourth lefthander to win this season (Joe Highsmith, Brian Harman, Garrick Higgo)
- Would become the first player from Scotland to win a FedExCup Playoffs event
- Chance to become the first wire-to-wire winner of the BMW Championship since Marc Leishman (2017) and second wire-to-wire winner this season (Scottie Scheffler/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (7.818)
- Seeking his third PGA TOUR win in his 76th start (2024 RBC Canadian Open, 2024 Genesis Scottish Open)

- **Harry Hall** (T4/-8), projected at No. 25 in the FedExCup standings, seeks to advance to the TOUR Championship for the first time in his third season on TOUR; 38 of his last 47 rounds on TOUR have been in the 60s
- **Maverick McNealy** (T6/-7), who made a double bogey on his final hole, is projected at No. 13 in the FedExCup standings and seeks to advance to the TOUR Championship for the first time in his sixth season on TOUR
