Scottie Scheffler (Won/-15)

- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader picks up his 18th PGA TOUR win in his 148th start at the age of 29 years, 1 month, 27 days
- Moves to T46 on the all-time wins list, tied with Julius Boros, Jim Ferrier, Dutch Harrison and Nick Price
- Enters the TOUR Championship No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the fourth consecutive year as he attempts to become the first back-to-back FedExCup champion
- TOUR-best fifth win of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship, BMW Championship)
- Second season with five or more wins (2024/7, 2025/5)
- Becomes the first player since Tiger Woods (2005-2007) to record five or more wins in back-to-back seasons
- One of 18 players to win multiple FedExCup Playoffs events (2024 TOUR Championship, 2025 BMW Championship)
- Second-largest come-from-behind win of his career: 5 (2024 PLAYERS Championship), 4 (2025 BMW Championship)
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 18 starts this season, with a season-high 15 top-10 finishes (including 13 straight); last finish outside the top 10: THE PLAYERS Championship (T20)
- Wins in his sixth appearance at the BMW Championship (T20/2020, T22/2021, T3/2022, T2/2023, T33/2024, Won/2025)

Robert MacIntyre (2nd/-13)

- Two-time PGA TOUR winner finishes runner-up for the third time in 76 starts (2023 Genesis Scottish Open, 2025 U.S. Open, 2025 BMW Championship)
- Was seeking to join Scottie Scheffler (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson) as the season's only wire-to-wire winners
- Becomes the first player to hold the outright lead the first three rounds at the BMW Championship and not win since Bob Dickson in 1976 (won by Al Geiberger)
- Third player this season to hold the outright lead each of the first three rounds and not win, joining Jake Knapp (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches/Joe Highsmith) and Joel Dahmen (Corales Puntacana Championship/Garrick Higgo)
- Second of 14 players who entered a FedExCup Playoffs event with a four-stroke lead or better who failed to win, with Scottie Scheffler finishing T2 at the 2022 TOUR Championship after leading by six after 54 holes

Miscellaneous Notes

- Maverick McNealy (3rd) advances to the TOUR Championship for the first time in his sixth season on TOUR
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (T4) earns his sixth top-five finish of the season, second only to Scottie Scheffler's 10; records his 44th top-10 finish in his 163rd start, the most of any player without a win on TOUR since 1983
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner and 2024 BMW Championship runner-up Sam Burns finishes T4
- Other notable finishes:
 - Three-time FedExCup champion Rory McIlroy (T12)
 - Defending BMW Championship winner Keegan Bradley (T17)
 - Last week's FedEx St. Jude Championship winner Justin Rose (T30)
 - Winner of the 2021 BMW Championship at Caves Valley Golf Club Patrick Cantlay (T30)
- Daniel Berger WD prior to the final round (injury)
