MEDICAL EXTENSION SUMMARY

If a player earns the points required to reach the top 125 threshold, he is eligible to play the remainder of the season out of the Major Medical category. If a player earns the points required to reach the top 150 threshold, but falls short of top 125, he is eligible to play the remainder of the season out of the 126-150 category, subject to reshuffle. If he does not reach either of these thresholds, he will fall back into the highest category for which he is eligible, or lose status.

Medical extension storylines

Will Gordon finished in an 8-way tie for 5th at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, earning 84.375 FedExCup points. Gordon needs a minimum of 0.644 points (one made cut) in his next three starts to maintain status on the PGA TOUR and 161.186 points to remain in the Major Medical category for the remainder of the season.

AON SWING 5

The Charles Schwab Challenge is the second event counting towards the Aon Swing 5 for the Memorial Tournament and Travelers Championship. The Aon Swing 5 for the Memorial Tournament uses points earned at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic and the Charles Schwab Challenge, while the Travelers Championship also includes FedExCup points earned at the RBC Canadian Open.

Ryan Fox enters the week No. 1 in the Aon Swing 5 standings after winning the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic. Although winners of additional events are not guaranteed spots in Signature Events, each additional event winner this season has gotten into the following Signature Event.

TOP 50 RETENTION TRACKING

28 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 of the current season's standings through the PGA Championship. At No. 5, Andrew Novak is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024 (No. 68 in 2024).

For reference:

- » Through the 2024 PGA Championship, 32 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings were in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- » 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.

ELIGIBILITY NOTES

David Ford makes professional debut

University of North Carolina senior David Ford is competing on a sponsor exemption as the winner of the Ben Hogan Collegiate Invitational and making his professional debut. Ford is projected to finish No. 1 when the PGA TOUR University Ranking is finalized at the conclusion of the stroke-play portion of the NCAA Championship, which would make him immediately eligible for PGA TOUR membership.

If Ford makes the cut at the Charles Schwab Challenge, he would earn non-member FedExCup points, and those points would become official when he joins the PGA TOUR as a regular member. He is expected to make his first start as a member at the RBC Canadian Open.

Winners prior to 2000

Olin Browne, David Frost and Corey Pavin are exempt as winners of the event prior to 2000 and are added to the field of 132 (field size is 135). Because they are added to the field, they would not be replaced by an alternate if they were to WD prior to beginning the tournament.
