Matti Schmid (T1/-13)

- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the second time; 0-for-1 to date (2022 ISCO Championship/T8; final-round 5-over 77)
- Making his second appearance at the Charles Schwab Challenge (MC/2024)
- Best opening 54-hole scores on TOUR (2022 ISCO Championship/194/finished T8, 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/196/3rd, 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge/197/TBD)
- Making his 79th start on TOUR and seeking his first career win (best finishes: 2024 Shriners Children's Open/T3, 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/3rd)
- Would become the eighth player to win his first PGA TOUR event at the Charles Schwab Challenge, with Sergio Garcia (2001) the most recent to do so
- There have been eight first-time winners this season, most recently Ryan Fox at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic
- Four players from Germany have won on TOUR (eight wins), most recently Stephan Jaeger at the 2024 Texas Children's Houston Open

Ben Griffin (T1/-13)

- Third 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR; 0-for-2 to date (2022 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T3, 2023 Sanderson Farms Championship/T2); along with teammate Andrew Novak, held the 54-hole lead in the Zurich Classic in New Orleans en route to winning
- Making his 94th start, seeking his second TOUR win (2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans); would join Rory McIlroy (3), Scottie Scheffler (2) and Sepp Straka (2) as multiple winners this season
- Would become the fourth player to win a stroke-play and team event in the same season since the Zurich Classic of New Orleans became a team event in 2017; Rory McIlroy is the most recent to perform the feat with wins at the 2024 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Shane Lowry) and the Truist Championship
- Best opening 54-hole scores on TOUR (2022 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/195/finished T3, 2023 Sanderson Farms Championship/196/finished P2, 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge/197/TBD)
- 18th start of the season where he has notched one win and five top-10 finishes (T7/The American Express, T4/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld, T4/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, Won/Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with teammate Andrew Novak, T8/PGA Championship)
- Making his third consecutive start at the Charles Schwab Challenge (T52/2023, MC/2024)

Scottie Scheffler (T7/-7)

- World No. 1 seeking to join Ben Hogan (1946) as the only players to win the Charles Schwab Challenge and THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson in the same season; would become the 16th player to win both events during their respective careers
- With a 6-under 64, shared round of the day honors with Robert MacIntyre (T4/-8) and Lucas Glover (T10/-6)
- In search of his fourth straight top-three finish at Colonial (2nd/2022, T3/2023, T2/2024)

• THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson and PGA Championship winner is seeking to become the first to win three consecutive starts since Dustin Johnson in 2017 (Genesis Invitational, WGC-Mexico Championship, WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)

Additional Player Notes

- The largest come-from-behind win at the Charles Schwab Challenge is seven strokes by Nick Price (1994) and Sam Burns (2022; defeated 54-hole leader Scottie Scheffler in a playoff)
- **Rickie Fowler** (3rd/-9) trails by four in bid for his seventh TOUR victory; will play in the final group for the first time since his most recent win at the 2023 Rocket Classic; making his 12th start at the Charles Schwab Challenge, with his best finish coming in 2012 (T5)
- Akshay Bhatia (T4/-8) trails by five in bid to win in three consecutive seasons (2023 Barracuda Championship, 2024 2024 Valero Texas Open)
- Tommy Fleetwood (T10/-6) has the most top 10 finishes without a win on the PGA TOUR since 1983 (40)
