Garrick Higgo (Won/-14)

- South African wins second PGA TOUR victory in his 95th start at age 25 years, 11 months, 8 days
- Youngest winner and the second player in their 20s to win this event (Chad Ramey/29/2022)
- Claimed first PGA TOUR win at the 2021 Palmetto Championship at Congaree in his second-ever start
- Wins 300 FedExCup points and PGA TOUR exemption through 2027; projected to move from No. 163 to No. 64 in the FedExCup standings
- Leads the Aon Swing 5 and looks to earn a spot in the next Signature Event, the 2025 Truist Championship
- Second appearance at the Corales Puntacana Championship (MC/72-73/2024)
- Third international winner of this event (Graeme McDowell/Northern Ireland, Matt Wallace/England); 12 of the first 18 events this season have been won by international players
- First lefthander to win the Corales Puntacana Championship and third to win this season: Joe Highsmith (2025 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), Brian Harman (Valero Texas Open)
- Made his third start this season while playing out of the 126-150 category in 2024 FedExCup Fall standings (T24/Farmers Insurance Open, T12/Puerto Rico Open, Won/Corales Puntacana Championship)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Sunday's final round featured zero bogey-free rounds
- In his first appearance at the Corales Puntacana Championship, **Alejandro Tosti** (T2/-13) posts his third top-10 this season, and sixth of his PGA TOUR career (T10/Mexico Open in VidantaWorld, T5/Texas Children's Houston Open)
- **Keith Mitchell** (T2/-13) comes up one stroke shy in his attempt to win his second PGA TOUR title six years after his first (2019 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches); finished runner-up to Brice Garnett at this event in 2018
- On the same day that his identical twin brother, Yannik, finishes third in the Volvo China Open on the DP World Tour, Germany's **Jeremy Paul** (T2/-13) records his best PGA TOUR result (previous: T16/2025 Puerto Rico Open)
- **Michael Thorbjornsen** (T2/-13) matches his best finish on TOUR: T2 at 2024 John Deere Classic, one of four top-10s
- After holding the solo lead through each of the first three rounds, **Joel Dahmen** (T2/-13) bogeys the final three holes en route to final-round 76 (+4); notched 18-hole (62) and 36-hole (128) tournament scoring records this week and tied the 54-hole (199) tournament record; held largest 36-hole (4 strokes) and 54-hole (3 strokes) leads in tournament history
- **Willy Pumarol** (T53/-1) posts the best finish by a player from the Dominican Republic in this event
