Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup Champion seeks to become first back-to-back winner of the FedExCup
- Making first start since earning 17th PGA TOUR victory and TOUR-best fourth win of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship)
- Four occasions with wins in back-to-back starts:
 - 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship
 - 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship
 - 2024 Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage
 - 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 16 starts this season, with a season-high 13 top-10 finishes (including 11 straight)
- Only player with top-10s in all four majors of 2025 (4th/Masters Tournament, 1st/PGA Championship, T7/U.S. Open, 1st/The Open Championship)
- Has three seasons with four or more wins (2022/4, 2024/7, 2025/4)
- FedExCup leader earned the top spot in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 for the third time in four seasons, earning an \$8 million bonus
- Official Money total of \$19,202,883 is currently the second-highest in a single season in PGA TOUR history (\$28,148,691 in 2024 and \$19,138,342 in 2022-23)

Harris English

- Enters the week No. 7 in the FedExCup; one of three players inside the top 10 who did not finish inside the top 50 in the 2024 FedExCup (No. 6 Ben Griffin, No. 8 J.J. Spaun)
- Along with his fifth PGA TOUR victory at the Farmers Insurance Open, has four top-10s in 18 starts this season
- Making first start since finishing runner-up at The Open Championship; both runner-up finishes this season came to World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler at majors (PGA Championship/T2, The Open Championship/2nd)
- First PGA TOUR victory came at the 2013 FedEx St. Jude Classic; held the 54-hole lead at the 2021 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational before finishing solo fourth

Aldrich Potgieter

- At No. 43 in the FedExCup, set to make FedExCup Playoffs debut
- Of the 35 rookies on the PGA TOUR for the 2025 season, only rookie to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- 2025 Rocket Classic champion is one of three rookies to win on the PGA TOUR this season (Karl Vilips/Puerto Rico Open, William Mouw/ISCO Championship)
- Youngest winner on TOUR this season at the age of 20 years, 9 months, 16 days
- Became the ninth player since 1983 to win on TOUR before the age of 21
- One of two South African winners on TOUR this season (Garrick Higgo/Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Leads the TOUR in Driving Distance (327.6) and ranks second in SG: Off-the-Tee (0.686)

Justin Thomas

- 2017 FedExCup Champion will make his 10th FedExCup Playoffs appearance in his 11th season as a member
- No. 5 in the FedExCup has seven top-10s in 17 starts this season, including a win at the RBC Heritage
- Owns 16 victories on the PGA TOUR dating back to the 2015-16 season, third most in that span (Rory McIlroy/18, Scottie Scheffler/17)
- Won the 2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational at TPC Southwind

FedEx St. Jude Championship notes:

- The top 70 players qualified for the FedEx St. Jude Championship with the top 50 advancing to next week's BMW Championship at Caves Valley Golf Club and qualifying for all eight Signature Events in 2026. The first two Playoffs events will award 2,000 FedExCup points to the winner as all players vie to make the top 30 and qualify for the TOUR Championship at East Lake Golf Club in Atlanta where the FedExCup Champion will be crowned.
- The 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship marks the fourth playing of the event at TPC Southwind
- The field includes:
 - Six FedExCup Champions: Scottie Scheffler (2024), Viktor Hovland (2023), Patrick Cantlay (2021), Justin Rose (2018), Justin Thomas (2017), Jordan Spieth (2015)
 - Five past champions of the FedEx St. Jude Championship: Hideki Matsuyama (2024), Lucas Glover (2023), Tony Finau (2021), Jason Day (2015), Adam Scott (2013)
 - Three winners of previous events held at TPC Southwind: Justin Thomas (2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational), Daniel Berger (2016, 2017 FedEx St. Jude Classic), Harris English (2013 FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- With 4,806 FedExCup points, **Scottie Scheffler** enters the FedExCup Playoffs with a 1,362-point lead over **Rory McIlroy** in the FedExCup standings, and 2,211 points clear of **Sepp Straka** (No. 3)
- **Sepp Straka** is one of six multiple winners on TOUR this season (The American Express, Truist Championship), his first multiple-win season since joining the TOUR in 2019; fell to Will Zalatoris on the third playoff hole at the 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- **Matti Schmid** entered the Wyndham Championship at No. 70 in the FedExCup and remained in his position following a T31 finish, which included birdies on his final three holes at Sedgefield Country Club
- **Xander Schauffele** (No. 42) and **Tony Finau** (No. 60) have qualified for the TOUR Championship in eight consecutive seasons entering the FedExCup Playoffs, the longest active streak on TOUR
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (No. 9) is the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings without a victory on the PGA TOUR; has 12 top-25s in 16 starts this season, highlighted by a runner-up finish at the Travelers Championship
- Winner of last week's Wyndham Championship, **Cameron Young** earned his first PGA TOUR title in his 94th start and became the 1,000th unique winner on TOUR; Lucas Glover won the Wyndham Championship and the FedEx St. Jude Championship the following week in 2023
- **Chris Kirk** (T5; from No. 73 to No. 61) is the only player that moved from outside the FedExCup Playoffs bubble at the Wyndham Championship to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- **Daniel Berger** returns to the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time since 2021; finished T2 at the 2024 RSM Classic in the last start of his tournament winner's exemption to move from No. 127 to No. 100 in the FedExCup Fall standings and secure TOUR membership for 2025

PGA TOUR season notes

- Entering the FedEx St. Jude Championship, 29 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 through the Wyndham Championship. At No. 6, Ben Griffin is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024. For reference, 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- Of the 11 first-time winners in 2025, nine qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs: Thomas Detry (WM Phoenix Open), Brian Campbell (Mexico Open at VidantaWorld), Joe Highsmith (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), Min Woo Lee (Texas Children's Houston Open), Ben Griffin/Andrew Novak (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Ryan Fox (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic), Aldrich Potgieter (Rocket Classic), Ryan Gerard (Barracuda Championship)
- Of the 16 international victories of the 36 of the FedExCup Regular Season events, 10 players qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs: Hideki Matsuyama/Japan, Nick Taylor/Canada, Sepp Straka/Austria/2, Rory McIlroy/Northern Ireland/3, Thomas Detry/Belgium, Ludvig Åberg/Sweden, Viktor Hovland/Norway, Min Woo Lee/Australia, Ryan Fox/New Zealand/2, Aldrich Potgieter/South Africa

FedExCup and the FedExCup Playoffs

- The 2025 PGA TOUR Season marks the 19th edition of the FedExCup (established in 2007)

- The FedExCup is a season-long points competition which culminates with the FedExCup Playoffs, a series of three events to determine the FedExCup Champion
- The top 70 players in the FedExCup standings are eligible for the FedExCup Playoffs with the three events featuring a progressive cut with fields of 70 (FedEx St. Jude Championship), 50 (BMW Championship) and 30 (TOUR Championship)
- The FedExCup Bonus Distribution total is \$100 million, with the FedExCup Champion earning \$10 million
 - The top 70 players in the FedExCup standings are fully exempt for all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026
 - The top 50 players are exempt for all Signature Events in 2026
 - The top 30 players receive a two-year exemption and invitations to majors that traditionally recognize the top 30
- **Top 50 bubble** – Following the FedEx St. Jude Championship, the top 50 players in the FedExCup will advance to the BMW Championship: Tom Hoge (No. 40), Matt Fitzpatrick (No. 41), Xander Schauffele (No. 42), Aldrich Potgieter (No. 43), Harry Hall (No. 44), Akshay Bhatia (No. 45), Si Woo Kim (No. 46), Jake Knapp (No. 47), Jordan Spieth (No. 48), Wyndham Clark (No. 49), Min Woo Lee (No. 50), J.T. Poston (No. 51), Kurt Kitayama (No. 52), Bud Cauley (No. 53), Joe Highsmith (No. 54), Aaron Rai (No. 55), Jhonattan Vegas (No. 56), Max Greyserman (No. 57), Stephan Jaeger (No. 58), Mackenzie Hughes (No. 59), Tony Finau (No. 60)
