Weather: Friday: Partly cloudy morning and afternoon thunderstorms. High of 93. Wind S 7-12 mph. **Saturday:** Mostly sunny morning. High of 84. Wind ESE 5-12 mph.

Suspension summary: Due to lightning in the area, Friday's second round was suspended at 3:31 p.m. CT with 19 players needing to complete the round. Play resumed Saturday morning at 7:30 a.m. and was completed at 9:24 a.m. The third round will feature threesomes off split tees from 9:40 – 11:52 a.m.

Tommy Fleetwood (1st/-13)

- 127 marks his low 36-hole total on the PGA TOUR (previous: 129/2018 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational)
- Marks his sixth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and second this season (Travelers Championship/finished T2)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (8.528) and Driving Accuracy (24 of 28)
- Has hit 24/28 (85.71%) fairways thru two rounds, his highest driving accuracy thru 36 holes in his PGA TOUR career (previous: 69.44%, 2 times, most recent: 2024 BMW Championship)
- At No. 9, is the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings without a victory on the PGA TOUR
- Seven-time DP World Tour winner has six runner-up finishes and 42 top-10 finishes, the most of any player without a win on TOUR since 1983
- Seeks to become 13th first-time winner on TOUR this season and 10th player to make the FedEx St. Jude Championship their maiden TOUR victory (most recent: Will Zalatoris/2022)
- With a win, would become the 12th international player to win a FedExCup Playoffs event (most recent: Hideki Matsuyama/2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship)
- Seeks to become the 18th different winner from England on TOUR (most recent: Aaron Rai/2024 Wyndham Championship)
- Four of his five top-10s this season have come in Signature Events: T5/The Genesis Invitational, 7th/RBC Heritage, T4/Truist Championship, T2/Travelers Championship; (other: T4/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Has one top-10 in five prior starts at the FedEx St. Jude Championship (T3/2023)
- Qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs for the fourth consecutive year (seventh total)

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the FedEx St. Jude Championship, the top 50 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for next week's BMW Championship (the second of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Following the second round, two players are projected to move inside the top 50:
 - Kurt Kitayama (T5), $52^{\text{nd}} \rightarrow 30^{\text{th}}$
 - o Bud Cauley (T8), $53^{rd} \rightarrow 37^{th}$
- Following the second round, two players are projected to move outside the top 50:
 - Jake Knapp (T57), $47^{th} \rightarrow 52^{nd}$
 - o Min Woo Lee (69th), $50^{th} \rightarrow 56^{th}$

Additional notes:

- 11-time PGA TOUR winner **Justin Rose** (2nd/-10) qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs for the 18th time in his 19th season on TOUR; entered the week No. 25 in the FedExCup standings after recording four top-10 finishes in 15 starts this season (best: P2/Masters Tournament); seeking his first win since the 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Collin Morikawa (T3/-9) cards a bogey-free 65, tied for his lowest round in seven career starts in the FedEx St. Jude Championship (65/R1/2023/finished T13); six-time PGA TOUR winner bidding for his first victory since the 2023 Baycurrent Classic
- 18-hole leader **Akshay Bhatia** (T3/-9) follows career-low 62 with a second round 69; two-time PGA TOUR winner is making his second career start at the FedEx St. Jude Championship (T12/2024) and has three top-10 finishes this season (T9/Genesis Invitational, 9th/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld, T3/PLAYERS Championship)
- Making first start since earning his 17th PGA TOUR victory at The Open Championship, World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup Champion **Scottie Scheffler** (T8/-7) has four occasions with wins in back-to-back starts (most recent: 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship); entered the week with top-10 finishes in each of his last 11 starts
