Playoff

- 20th playoff in tournament history and first since 2023 (Lucas Glover def. Patrick Cantlay)
- Marks 10th playoff on TOUR this season (most recent: John Deere Classic, Brian Campbell def. Emiliano Grillo)
- Playoff records:
 - o Justin Rose: 2-4 (wins: 2025 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2014 Quicken Loans National)
 - o J.J. Spaun: 0-2 (both this season: THE PLAYERS Championship, FedEx St. Jude Championship)

Justin Rose (Winner/-16)

- Earns 12th career PGA TOUR title in his 443rd start at the age 45 years, 11 days
- 2018 FedExCup Champion clinches second career FedExCup Playoff victory in his 57th playoff start (2011 BMW Championship)
- First PGA TOUR victory since the 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- Earns 2,000 FedExCup points and climbs from No. 25 to No. 4 in the FedExCup standings
- Projected to move from No. 20 to No. 9 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- With the win, becomes the 94th player to record at least 12 wins on TOUR
- Oldest winner on TOUR since Phil Mickelson at the 2021 PGA Championship (50 years, 11 months, 7 days)
- Holds most wins on TOUR of any player from England since 1940 (second most: Nick Faldo, 9 wins)
- Last player from England to win on TOUR: Aaron Rai/2024 Wyndham Championship
- Led the field with 26 total birdies this week (next best: 23, Scottie Scheffler and Tommy Fleetwood)

J.J. Spaun (P2/-16)

- Records third runner-up finish of the season (P2/THE PLAYERS Championship, T2/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), tied with Justin Thomas for the most by any player this year
- Second playoff loss of his career (2025 PLAYERS Championship, def. by Rory McIlroy)
- 2025 U.S. Open winner records his sixth top-10 finish in 21 starts this season
- Moves up to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings after entering the week No. 8

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the FedEx St. Jude Championship, the top 50 players in the FedExCup standings have qualified for next week's BMW Championship (the second of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Five players moved inside the top 50:
 - o Kurt Kitayama (T9), 52nd \rightarrow 37th

- o **Bud Cauley** (T14), 53rd \rightarrow 46th
- Rickie Fowler (T6), 64th \rightarrow 48th
- **Jhonattan Vegas** (T14), 56th \rightarrow 49th
- o **J.T. Poston** (T22), 51st \rightarrow 50th
- Five players are moved outside the top 50:
 - Aldrich Potgieter (T59), $43rd \rightarrow 52nd$
 - **Jordan Spieth** (T38), $48th \rightarrow 54th$
 - Jake Knapp (T62), $47th \rightarrow 55th$
 - **Wyndham Clark** (T56), 49th \rightarrow 56th
 - Min Woo Lee (T68), $50th \rightarrow 57^{th}$
- 29 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 through the FedEx St. Jude Championship. For reference, 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.

Additional notes:

- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader Scottie Scheffler (T3/-15) records his 12th consecutive top-10 finish and 14th of the season
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (T3/-15) records the 43rd top-10 finish of his PGA TOUR career in his 162nd start, the most of any player without a win on TOUR since 1983; 36- and 54-hole outright leader cards a final-round 69 and earns his sixth top-10 finish of the season
- Cameron Young (5th/-11), winner of last week's Wyndham Championship, cards the low round of the day with a 6-under 64
