MEDICAL EXTENSION SUMMARY

If a player earns the points required to reach the top 125 threshold, he is eligible to play the remainder of the season out of the Major Medical category. If a player earns the points required to reach the top 150 threshold, but falls short of top 125, he is eligible to play the remainder of the season out of the 126-150 category, subject to reshuffle. If he does not reach either of these thresholds, he will fall back into the highest category for which he is eligible, or lose status.

Medical Extension storylines

Bronson Burgoon (Korn Ferry Tour Major Medical Extension) and MJ Daffue (non-exempt Major Medical Extension) are making their final starts at the ISCO Championship. Both players have Korn Ferry Tour eligibility should they not fulfill their medical

Burgoon needs a 2-way T2 or better to meet his top-125 point total (would move to the top of the DP World Tour/Korn Ferry Tour/Q-School category). If he finishes worse than 2-way T2 but 2-way T30 or better, he would retain membership and move into the reorder category. If he finishes worse than 2-way T30, he will lose PGA TOUR membership.

Daffue needs a win to continue his PGA TOUR membership for the remainder of the 2025 season. For context on Daffue's "non-exempt" Major Medical Extension, he was competing out of the 126-150 category in the season which he was injured. As a result, he does not receive exempt status through his medical extension.

Ben Martin missed the cut at the John Deere in his final start on his Major Medical Extension and moved to No. 11 in the reorder category.

TOP 50 RETENTION TRACKING

28 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 of the current season's standings through the Rocket Classic. At No. 6, Ben Griffin is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024 (No. 57 in 2024).

For reference:

- » Through the 2024 John Deere Classic, 34 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings were in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- » 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.

Field makeup

Genesis Scottish Open:

- » 75 players from the PGA TOUR
- » 75 players from the DP World Tour
- » Three players from the KPGA
- » Three unrestricted tournament invitations

ISCO Championship:

- » 50 players from the DP World Tour
- » Remainder from PGA TOUR Priority Ranking

Non-member regulations at the ISCO Championship and Barracuda Championship

If a non-member (or Special Temporary Member) wins the ISCO Championship or next week's Barracuda Championship:

- » One-year exemption, through 2026 (rather than two through 2027)
- » No FedExCup points (but any non-member FedExCup points earned in previous events this season would be converted to the FedExCup points list)
- » No Official Money (would receive the winner's share in unofficial money)

If a non-member finishes in the top-10 at the ISCO Championship or Barracuda Championship, he would **not** earn a spot in the next event.
