Chris Gotterup (1st/-11)

- Ties the course record at The Renaissance Club with a 61 (Bernd Wiesberger/2019/R2, Cameron Tringale/2022/R1, Byeong Hun An/2023/R1, Richard Mansell/2024/R4)
- Tops his previous-best round on the PGA TOUR by two strokes (63/R1/2025 Puerto Rico Open)
- At 129, sets personal-best 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 130/2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic/won)
- Opens round with personal-best nine-hole score (29)
- Has one victory in 61 PGA TOUR starts, winning the 2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic by six strokes
- Victory in Myrtle Beach marks his only top-10 finish in his last 56 starts on TOUR
- Holds the second-round lead/co-lead for the second time (2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic/won)
- Made 140' 8" of putts in round two, compared to 51' 8" in round one

- **Harry Hall** (2nd/-9) seeks his second PGA TOUR victory in his 84th start; won the ISCO Championship this week a year ago (won on July 14, 2024)
- Rory McIlroy (T6/-7) posts a second-round 5-under 65 in bid to become the first player to win the Masters Tournament and Genesis Scottish Open in the same season; after closing the first round with three straight birdies, birdied five of his first seven holes to start round two
- Xander Schauffele (T12/-6) makes the cut for the 68th straight time dating to the 2022 Masters Tournament, the longest active streak on TOUR and sixth-longest streak in TOUR history (Tiger Woods/142; Byron Nelson/113; Jack Nicklaus/105; Hale Irwin/86; Dow Finsterwald/72)
- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T21/-5) trails by six following a second-round 68
- **Robert MacIntyre** (T64/-1) makes the cut on the number in bid to become the first player to successfully defend at the Genesis Scottish Open
