Chris Gotterup (Won/-15)

- Wins the Genesis Scottish Open by two strokes over fellow 54-hole co-leader Rory McIlroy and Marco Penge
- Wins his second PGA TOUR title (2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic) in his 62nd start at the age of 25 years, 11 months, 23 days
- Collects 500 points and is projected to move to No. 39 in the FedExCup standings
- Projected to move from No. 158 into the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Improves to 2-for-2 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
- Week included a personal-best, course record-tying 9-under 61 during the second round
- Has two top-10 finishes in his last 57 starts on TOUR, both wins
- Previous-best finish this season: T12 (Zurich Classic of New Orleans/with teammate Quade Cummins)
- Earns a spot in next week's Open Championship at Royal Portrush

Additional Player Notes

- 29-time PGA TOUR winner **Rory McIlroy** finishes runner-up for the 12th time in 270 starts; was seeking to become the first player to win the Masters Tournament and Genesis Scottish Open in the same season
- **Marco Penge** finishes runner-up in bid for his second win on the DP World Tour this season (Hainan Classic); only other made cut on the PGA TOUR came earlier this season at the PGA Championship (T28)
- **Nico Echavarria** (T22) aces the par-3 sixth hole with a 60-degree wedge from 120 yards; marks his second ace on TOUR (2023 RSM Classic/R3/No. 6); as a result of the ace, wins a Genesis GV60
- **Notable finishes:**
 - World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T8) has finished inside the top 25 in all 15 starts this season, with 10 consecutive top-10 finishes
 - One week before defending his 2024 Open Championship victory, **Xander Schauffele** finishes T8
 - Defending champion **Robert MacIntyre** finishes T65
- The Genesis Scottish Open is the final event of The Open Qualifying Series (OQS) where three spots were available into next week's 153rd Open at Royal Portrush; the top three players, not otherwise exempt, who made the cut at the Genesis Scottish Open earned an exemption: **Chris Gotterup, Nicolai Højgaard, Matti Schmid**
