**Today** – Temperatures will warm into the lower 80s this afternoon with increasing cloud cover. Dry conditions are expected through sunset with a low (10-20%) threat for a shower developing this evening. Easterly winds should hold throughout the day with gusts over 15 mph.

**Extended forecast** – Moisture lifting northward should allow areas of showers to develop across south Florida tonight into Sunday morning (highest threat between 12-8am). T-storm development could also occur, but the higher threat likely remains offshore. **Forecast rainfall overnight: Generally, less than 0.25" but amounts over 0.50" are possible in a T-storm.** The more organized precipitation should come to an end between 7-9am Sunday, although a threat for a shower could linger into the early afternoon. Winds should also become northwesterly with gusts of 15-20 mph possible.
