## **Tiger Woods**

- Tournament host will not compete at the Hero World Challenge as he continues to recover from lumbar disc replacement surgery in October
- Won the Hero World Challenge five times (all at Sherwood Country Club), most recently in 2011; last competed at the Hero World Challenge in 2023 (18<sup>th</sup>)
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner last competed on TOUR at the 2024 Open Championship (MC)

#### **Scottie Scheffler**

- Two-time defending champion of the Hero World Challenge seeks to become the first to win three consecutive titles
- Making his first start on TOUR since winning the Procore Championship in September for his 19<sup>th</sup> career PGA TOUR victory and sixth of the season
- Winner of the Byron Nelson Award for Low Scoring Average (68.131); led the TOUR in Par 4 Scoring Average (3.89) and Bounce Back Percentage (36.36%)
- Recorded a TOUR-best 17 top-10s and did not miss a cut
- Fifth appearance at Hero World Challenge (Won/2024, Won/2023, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2022, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2021)
- Never shot an over-par 18-hole score at the Hero World Challenge (12 rounds)
- 72-hole total of 263 in 2024 tied the tournament record since the event moved to Albany in 2015 (Bubba Watson/2015)

#### J.J. Spaun

- One of three players making their Hero World Challenge debut this week (Chris Gotterup, Andrew Novak)
- Seven top-10 finishes in 25 starts in 2025, including three runner-up results (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, THE PLAYERS Championship, FedEx St. Jude Championship) and his second career PGA TOUR title at the U.S. Open
- Finished T25 in the FedExCup and made his first career appearance at the TOUR Championship
- Made two starts during the FedExCup Fall (6<sup>th</sup>/Procore Championship, T11/World Wide Technology Championship)
- World No. 6 ended the 2024 calendar year at No. 119 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Ranked inside the top 10 in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (8<sup>th</sup>/1.045) and Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (5<sup>th</sup>/0.738) during the 2025 season

## **Keegan Bradley**

Eight-time PGA TOUR winner is making his first start on TOUR since finishing T7 at the TOUR Championship

- Six top-10 finishes in 2025, including his win at the Travelers Championship; has at least one victory on TOUR in each of the last three seasons
- Most recently competed in the "The Skins Game" on Nov. 28, collecting 11 skins worth \$2.1 million to win in the return of the competition against Tommy Fleetwood, Shane Lowry and Xander Schauffele at Panther National Golf Club
- Making his eighth career appearance at the Hero World Challenge and fourth at Albany Golf Course; finished solo fifth in 2024

## **Hero World Challenge Notes**

- The Hero World Challenge, an unofficial PGA TOUR event played annually following the FedExCup Fall, returns to Albany in the Bahamas for the 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive time, and 26<sup>th</sup> edition overall
- Past host venues include Grayhawk Golf Club (2000), Sherwood Country Club (2000-2013) and Isleworth (2014)
- 2014 Hero World Challenge champion **Jordan Spieth** joins Scottie Scheffler (2023, 2024) and Hideki Matsuyama (2016) as past champions in the field. Spieth is making his first start on TOUR since the FedEx St. Jude Championship (T38); finished the FedExCup Playoffs at No. 54 in the standings and dropped to No. 61 by the conclusion of the FedExCup Fall
- Eleven of the 20 players in the field won a PGA TOUR event in 2025: Keegan Bradley, Harris English, Chris Gotterup, Brian Harman, Hideki Matsuyama, Andrew Novak, Justin Rose, Scottie Scheffler, J.J. Spaun, Sepp Straka, Cameron Young
- Andrew Novak (Zurich Classic of New Orleans) and Cameron Young (Wyndham Championship) both claimed their first career PGA TOUR titles in 2025
- All three players making their Hero World Challenge debut ended the 2024 calendar year outside the top 100 in the Official World Golf Ranking: J.J. Spaun (No. 119 to No. 6), Chris Gotterup (No. 191 to No. 28), Andrew Novak (No. 123 to No. 31)
- Eight players in the field competed in the 2025 Ryder Cup: Sam Burns, Harris English, Robert MacIntyre, Justin Rose, Scottie Scheffler, J.J. Spaun, Sepp Straka, Cameron Young; joining them is 2025 U.S. Team captain Keegan Bradley and Team Europe vice captain Alex Noren
- Three sponsor exemptions: Akshay Bhatia, Billy Horschel, Jordan Spieth
- Eligible players for the Hero World Challenge are as follows:
  - o Defending champion of the Hero World Challenge
  - Current year winners of THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, PGA Championship, U.S.
     Open and The Open Championship
  - Three sponsor exemptions restricted to players ranked among the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking as of Monday, Aug. 25
  - To complete the field of 20 players, the top available players from the Official World Golf Ranking as of Monday Aug. 25
