Weather: Mostly sunny. High of 93. Winds SSW at 5-10 mph.

36-Hole Cut: 67 professionals and one amateur at 1-over 141 from a field of 154 professionals and two amateurs. 1-over is the highest 36-hole cut (to par) in the 10-year history of the ISCO Championship.

Chan Kim (1st/-11)

- 35-year-old seeks first PGA TOUR title in his 70th start; best finish on TOUR: T5 (2025 Valero Texas Open)
- Eagled the par-4 fourth hole for the second consecutive day, holing out from 36 yards on Friday; 11th instance of a player eagling the same par 4 in the first two rounds of an event on TOUR since 1983
- 129 is his low 36-hole score on TOUR; previous best: 131 (two times: 2024 American Express, 2024 John Deere Classic)
- First time leading/co-leading after 36 holes; previous best 36-hole position on TOUR: T3 (2024 Barracuda Championship/finished T29)
- Looks to become the second wire-to-wire winner this season on TOUR (Scottie Scheffler/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Looks to become the first wire-to-wire winner of the ISCO Championship, which dates back to 2015
- Looks to become the 10th first-time winner on TOUR this season (most recent: Aldrich Potgieter/Rocket Classic)
- Would be the fifth consecutive winner of the ISCO Championship to be a first-time winner on TOUR (2024/Harry Hall, 2023/Vincent Norrman, 2022/Trey Mullinax, 2021/Seamus Power)
- Posted two top-10 results this season, in back-to-back starts (T5/Valero Texas Open, T7/Corales Puntacana Championship); entered the week No. 103 in the FedExCup standings
- Making second appearance at ISCO Championship (T10/2024)

Additional notes

- Lexington, Kentucky native **Vince Whaley** (T2/-6) cards his 21st consecutive round of par or better on TOUR, the longest active streak; makes his ninth consecutive cut of the 2025 season after making five of the first 11 cuts
- Norway's **Kris Ventura** (T2/-6) matches his low 18-hole score of the 2025 season (64/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld/R1); posts his low 36-hole score in an individual stroke play event on TOUR (134)
- Starting on No. 10, **Thomas Rosenmueller** (T2/-6) closes eagle-birdie-par on Nos. 7-9 after playing his first 15 holes in 2-over
- **Beau Hossler** (T5/-5) seeks his first win on TOUR in his 223rd start; among the players in the field, has the fifth-most starts without a win

- Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Kevin Kisner** (T5/-5) makes his second cut of the 2025 season in his 14th start (T70/Valspar Championship); opens with back-to-back rounds in the 60s (66-69) for the first time since the 2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- Kentucky native **Josh Teater** (T27/-1) makes his first cut on TOUR since the 2024 World Wide Technology Championship; in seven previous appearances at the ISCO Championship, his best finish is T6 (2019)
- Auburn University sophomore **Jackson Koivun** (T27/-1) makes it three consecutive years an amateur has made the cut at the ISCO Championship (2024/Luke Clanton, 2023/David Ford); 16-year-old amateur **Miles Russell** (MC/+3) cards 73
- On his 28th birthday, sponsor exemption **Marcus Byrd** (T54/+1) makes his second cut on TOUR in his eighth start (T53/2024 RSM Classic); made a par putt from 6-feet-9-inches on No. 18 to make the cut on the number
- Hurstbourne Country Club member **Stephen Stallings, Jr.** (T54/+1), who attended St. Xavier High School in Louisville, Kentucky, makes his first cut on TOUR since the 2023 Corales Puntacana Championship
- **Erik Barnes** withdrew during the second round
