William Mouw (1st/-10)

- Earns his first win on TOUR in his 20th start at the age of 24 years, 10 months, 8 days
- Entering this week, his lone top-10 finish on TOUR was T6 (2025 Puerto Rico Open)
- Seven-stroke comeback is the largest final-round comeback on TOUR since the 2023 Sentry (Jon Rahm/7 strokes); sets the largest final-round comeback at the ISCO Championship (previous: 3 strokes; three times)
- Becomes the first player to earn his first PGA TOUR win in a final-round comeback of seven or more strokes since Smylie Kaufman (7 strokes/2015 Shriners Children's Open)
- Cards his low 18-hole score on TOUR; previous low: 65 (2025 Puerto Rico Open/R1); matches the low 18-hole score by any player this week (61/Chan Kim/R1)
- 61 is the low finish by a winner on TOUR since the 2023 RSM Classic (61/Ludvig Åberg)
- First player to have a bogey-free final round en route to victory at the ISCO Championship
- Nine birdies matches his most in a round on TOUR (2025 American Express/R3)
- Becomes the third rookie winner of the 2025 season (Karl Vilips/Puerto Rico Open, Aldrich Potgieter/Rocket Classic)
- Becomes the 10th first-time winner on TOUR this season (most recent: Aldrich Potgieter/Rocket Classic)
- Is the fifth consecutive winner of the ISCO Championship to be a first-time winner on TOUR (2024/Harry Hall, 2023/Vincent Norrman, 2022/Trey Mullinax, 2021/Seamus Power)
- Third consecutive winner of the ISCO Championship to win in his tournament debut (2024/Harry Hall, 2023 Vincent Norrman)
- Earns 300 FedExCup Points and moves up to No. 83 in the FedExCup standings
- Earns an exemption on the PGA TOUR through 2027 along with a spot in the 2026 Sentry, 2026 PLAYERS Championship and 2026 PGA Championship
- Posts the highest winning score in relation to par in the 10-year history of the ISCO Championship;
 previous: 18-under (2016/Aaron Baddeley)

Additional notes

- 54-hole leader **Paul Peterson** (2nd/-9) earns his best finish on TOUR and second top-10 in 20 starts (T10/2025 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- DP World Tour member **Manuel Elvira** (3rd/-7) earns his best finish on the PGA TOUR in three starts following his first made cut; brother Nacho played at this week's Genesis Scottish Open (MC)

- Lexington, Kentucky native **Vince Whaley** (T4/-6) records his best finish of the 2025 season (previous: T7/Corales Puntacana Championship) and second top-five at the ISCO Championship (5th/2022)
- Auburn University sophomore **Jackson Koivun** (T6/-5) earns his first top-10 finish on TOUR in seven starts (previous best finish: T11/2025 John Deere Classic); second top-10 by an amateur this season on TOUR (Kieron van Wyk/T4/Puerto Rico Open)
- **Kevin Kisner** (T8/-4) earns his first top-10 finish on TOUR since the 2022 Travelers Championship (T6), 1,113 days ago
