Justin Rose (1st/-8)

- Englishman holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead at the Masters Tournament for the third time (2004/T22, 2021/T7); holds the second-round lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR for the 17th time; 4-for-16 to date
- Holds lead/co-lead after any round at the Masters for the 10th time, joining Raymond Floyd (10) and Tiger Woods (10); only three players have held more leads/co-leads after any round at the Masters: Jack Nicklaus (19), Arnold Palmer (18), Gary Player (12)
- Three of 15 second-round leaders/co-leaders have gone on to win on the PGA TOUR this season, most recently Brian Harman, at last week's Valero Texas Open
- Making his 20th Masters appearance, owns six top-10s in 19 prior starts; was T2 to Jordan Spieth in 2015 and lost a playoff to Sergio Garcia in 2017
- Two top-10s in six PGA TOUR starts this season, both coming in Signature Events (T3/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T8/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- With a victory by Rose, England would join South Africa (5) as the country with the second-most wins behind Spain (6) at the Masters

Miscellaneous Notes

- Eight different countries are represented among players T9 or better on the leaderboard
- **Bryson DeChambeau** (2nd/-7) joins Xander Schauffele with the most rounds in the 60s at major championships since the start of 2024 (10); ranks No.1 in average driving distance this week (331.6 yards)
- **Rory McIlroy** (T3/-6) records his sixth round of 66 or lower at the Masters, tied most behind only Tiger Woods (8); carded two double bogeys in the first round (Nos. 15 and 17); only Craig Stadler (1982) and Gay Brewer (1967) went on to win the Masters Tournament after making two or more double bogeys for the week
- In 24 major championship starts, **Corey Connors** (T3/-6) owns four top-10s, including three at the Masters (T10/2020, T8/2021, T6/2022); also T9/2024 U.S. Open
- With a 4-under 68, **Shane Lowry** (T5/-5) matches his low round at the Masters Tournament for the fifth time (32 rounds)
- **Scottie Scheffler** (T5/-5) makes his first bogey of the tournament at the par-4 7th hole; 24 bogey-free holes marks the second longest bogey-free streak to start the tournament by a defending champion (Ian Woosnam/27 holes/1992)
- **Tyrrell Hatton** (T5/-5) makes his seventh cut in nine starts at the Masters; 69-70 marks first time with back-to-back under par rounds in a Masters
- **Matt McCarty** (T5/-5), one of a record eight lefthanded invitees this week, began double bogey, bogey en route to a 4-under 68; in the last 22 years at the Masters, only three players have finished a round under par after being 3-over or higher through two holes:
