## Rory McIlroy (1<sup>st</sup>/-12)

- First player in Masters history to start a round with six consecutive 3s on the scorecard; second player in Masters history to record six consecutive 3s during one round (Jack Renner/1983/R1/Nos. 12-17)
- First time making two eagles in one round at the Masters (Nos. 2 and 15) and first player to do so since 2020 (three players)
- Joins Jordan Spieth (2015), Tiger Woods (2005, 1997), Raymond Floyd (1976) and Johnny Miller (1975) as players with consecutive rounds of 66 or better at a Masters
- 20<sup>th</sup> 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke play events on TOUR (11-for-19 to date): most recent, 2023 Genesis Scottish Open/Won
- Second 54-hole lead/co-lead at the Masters (2011/T15) and seventh 54-hole lead/co-lead in major championships (4-for-6 to date)
- Current FedExCup leader is the only multiple winner this season (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, THE PLAYERS Championship)

## Rory McIlroy With a Win:

- Completes career Grand Slam, joining Gene Sarazen, Ben Hogan, Gary Player, Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods:
  - o 90 years after Gene Sarazen/1935 Masters
  - o 60 years after Gary Player/1965 U.S. Open
  - o 25 years after Tiger Woods/2000 Open
- Fifth major championship victory and 29<sup>th</sup> PGA TOUR title
- In his 17<sup>th</sup> Masters appearance, marks second-most attempts to earn first Masters title: Sergio Garcia/Won 2017 Masters in 19<sup>th</sup> start
- 21<sup>st</sup> player to win five major championship titles
- Third player to come from seven strokes back after the first round to win the Masters (Nick Faldo/1990, Tiger Woods/2005)
- 11 years since his last major championship victory (ties five players for longest all-time between major championship wins, most recent: Tiger Woods/2008 U.S. Open 2019 Masters)
- Third player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and the Masters Tournament in the same year: Tiger Woods (2001), Scottie Scheffler (2024)
- Third Masters champion with at least two double bogeys: R1/Nos. 15 and 17 (Craig Stadler/1982, Gay Brewer/1967)

## **Miscellaneous Notes**

- With a final-round score in the 60s, **Bryson DeChambeau** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-10) would join Cameron Smith (67-68-69-69/2020/T2) as the only players to shoot all four rounds in the 60s in a single tournament; owns the most rounds in the 60s at major championships since the start of 2024 (11); in each of the last eight Masters, the eventual champion sat T2 or better through 54 holes
- Corey Conners (3<sup>rd</sup>/-8) seeks his best finish in a major championship (previous, T6/2022 Masters Tournament); looks to join Mike Weir (2003) as the only Masters champions from Canada
- Patrick Reed (T4/-6), Scottie Scheffler (T6/-5) and Zach Johnson (T10/-4) are the only past Masters champions among players at T10 or better on the leaderboard; Johnson's 6-under 66 marks a span of 28 rounds since his last round in the 60s at the Masters (68/R4/2015)

- Ludvig Åberg (T4/-6) is five strokes better on the par-5 15<sup>th</sup> through three rounds in 2025 (birdie, par, birdie) than he was on the same hole in 2024 when he was a cumulative 3-over en route to a runner-up finish
- Colombia's Nico Echavarria (T10/-4) is the only player making his Masters debut who sits T10 or better
