Rory McIlroy

- 2025 Masters Tournament champion and World No. 2 is a four-time winner at Quail Hollow Club, winning the Trust Championship in 2010, 2015, 2021 and 2024
- With his win at the Masters Tournament, became the sixth player to complete the Career Grand Slam
- Last player to win the Masters and PGA Championship in the same year (Jack Nicklaus/1975)
- Last to win consecutive majors: Jordan Spieth (2015 Masters Tournament, 2015 U.S. Open)
- With wins at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, THE PLAYERS Championship and Masters Tournament, is one of two multiple winners this season (Sepp Straka)
- Fifth PGA TOUR season with three or more victories (2012/4, 2014/3, 2019/3, 2022/3)
- Eight top-10 finishes in 16 starts at the PGA Championships (wins: 2012, 2014)
- Finished T22 at the 2017 PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club

Xander Schauffele

- World No. 3 seeking to become the first player to successfully defend at the event since Brooks Koepka (2019)
- At 21-under, won the 2024 PGA Championship by one stroke over Bryson DeChambeau; marked the lowest score in relation to par in major championship history
- Has 12 consecutive top-20 finishes in major championships, dating to a T13 at the 2022 PGA Championship
- Nine-time PGA TOUR winner seeks his first victory on TOUR since the 2024 Open Championship
- Making his ninth start at the PGA Championship, with top-10 finishes in 2020 (T10) and 2024 (1st)
- Made his PGA Championship debut in 2017 at Quail Hollow Club where he missed the cut with rounds of 74-81
- Has four consecutive top-20 finishes on TOUR (Valspar Championship/T12, Masters Tournament/T8, RBC Heritage/T18, Trust Championship/T11)
- One top-10 in seven starts this season (T8/Masters Tournament)

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup champion in search of second victory of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Tied the lowest 72-hole score in PGA TOUR history with his 253 total at TPC Craig Ranch en route to a wire-to-wire victory by eight strokes, the largest margin of victory on TOUR this season
- In nine starts this season, has six top-10s (T9/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T3/The Genesis Invitational, T2/Texas Children's Houston Open, 4th/Masters Tournament, T8/RBC Heritage, 1st/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- 14-time PGA TOUR winner seeks third major championship victory (2022, 2024 Masters Tournament)
- Four top-10 finishes in five starts at the PGA Championship (T4/2020, T8/2021, MC/2022, T2/2023, T8/2024)

Jordan Spieth

- 13-time PGA TOUR winner seeking to become the seventh player to win the Career Grand Slam
- Three major championship wins in 48 starts: 2015 Masters Tournament, 2015 U.S. Open, 2017 Open Championship
- 12th start of the season, with three top 10-finishes (T4/WPM Phoenix Open, T9/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, 4th/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson); playing in the final year of his Tournament Winners exemption
- Two top-10 finishes in 12 starts at the PGA Championship (2nd/2015, T3/2019)
- Finished T28 at the 2017 PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club

Sepp Straka

- Captured his fourth PGA TOUR title last week at the Truist Championship
- Last player to win a major championship the week after winning on TOUR: Rory McIlroy (2014 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2014 PGA Championship)
- The American Express and Truist Championship winner joins Rory McIlroy as the season's only multiple winners
- 16th start in a major championship, with a T2 at the 2023 Open Championship his best outing
- Finished T7 in 2023 for his best finish among four PGA Championship starts
- Moved to No. 9 in the Official World Golf Ranking with his victory at the Truist Championship, joining the top 10 for the first time in his career

Justin Thomas

- Two-time PGA Championship winner (2017, 2022) won in 2017 at Quail Hollow Club by two strokes over Francesco Molinari, Patrick Reed and Louis Oosthuizen
- World No. 5 has six top-10s in 11 starts this season, including his victory at the RBC Heritage and three runner-up results (The American Express, Valspar Championship, Truist Championship), the most of any player on TOUR this season
- 16-time PGA TOUR winner seeks third major championship victory (2017, 2022 PGA Championship)
- Will be making his 10th start at the event, with four top-10 finishes (1st/2017, T6/2018, 1st/2022, T8/2024)

PGA Championship notes:

- Second major championship of the season (Rory McIlroy/Masters Tournament)
- Quail Hollow Club will host the PGA Championship for the second time (2017; won by Justin Thomas)
- Field headlined by 49 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking (Billy Horschel), headlined by World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler, No. 2 Rory McIlroy, No. 3 Xander Schauffele, No. 4 Collin Morikawa and No. 5 Justin Thomas
- Adam Scott is scheduled to make his 95th consecutive major championship appearance, dating to the 2001 Open Championship; only Jack Nicklaus (146) has played in more than 100 straight majors
- Additional field features:
 - All 69 players who played at last week's Truist Championship, including champion Sepp Straka
 - Champion Ryan Fox was one of seven players in the field who finished inside the top 10 at last week's ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic; the others: Mackenzie Hughes (P2), Kevin Yu (4th), Niklas Norgaard (T5), Rico Hoey (T7), Sami Valimaki (T7), Thorbjørn Olesen (T7)
 - Four players in the field finished inside the top five at the 2017 PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club: Justin Thomas (1st), Patrick Reed (T2), Rickie Fowler (T5), Hideki Matsuyama (T5)
 - In the seven editions of the Truist Championship played at Quail Hollow Club since 2015, seven players in the field posted two or more top-five finishes: Jason Day (1st/2018, T4/2024), Rickie Fowler (T4/2016, T4/2019), Rory McIlroy (1st/2015, T4/2016, 1st/2021, 1st/2024), Phil Mickelson (T4/2015, T4/2016, T5/2018), Justin Rose (3rd/2016, 3rd/2019), Xander Schauffele (2nd/2023, 2nd/2024), Gary Woodland (T4/2015, 5th/2021)
 - 13 past champions (18 wins): Keegan Bradley (2011), Jason Day (2015), Jason Dufner (2013), Pádraig Harrington (2008), Martin Kaymer (2010), Brooks Koepka (2018, 2019, 2023), Rory McIlroy (2012, 2014),

- Shaun Micheel (2003), Phil Mickelson (2005, 2021), Collin Morikawa (2020), Xander Schauffele (2024), Justin Thomas (2017, 2022), Jimmy Walker (2016)
