Third-Round Notes – Saturday, May 17, 2025

Weather: Morning thunderstorms turning to sunny skies in the afternoon. High of 86. Wind WSW 14-18 mph, with gusts to 28 mph. The start of the round was delayed due to dangerous weather conditions, with tournament officials making the change to threesomes off Nos. 1 and 10 from 11:43 a.m. - 1:55 p.m.

Scottie Scheffler (1st/-11) – with a victory

- Would earn third major championship title (2022, 2024 Masters Tournament) in his 23rd start in a major
- Would become the 48th player with three or more major championships
- 14 players have won the Masters Tournament and PGA Championship in their career (most recent: Rory McIlroy)
- Would become the 65th player with 15 or more wins on the PGA TOUR; would move to T59 on the all-time wins list
- Would join Rory McIlroy and Sepp Straka as multiple winners this season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Would be his fourth consecutive season with multiple wins (2022/4; 2023/2; 2024/7; 2025/2)
- Would earn his fifth top-10 finish in six PGA Championship starts (T4/2020, T8/2021, *MC/2022*, T2/2023, T8/2024)
- Would record the 40th victory by a 54-hole leader/co-leader in PGA Championship history
- Would improve to 3-for-3 when leading/co-leading after 54 holes at a major (2022, 2024 Masters Tournament)
- Holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the 16th time; is 9-for-15 to date when leading/co-leading entering the final round in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, having converted his last five

Alex Noren (2nd/-8) – with a victory

- Would earn first major championship title in his 40th start in a major (best finish: T6/2017 Open Championship)
- Would pick up his first PGA TOUR win in his 185th start; has three runner-up finishes (2018 Farmers Insurance Open, 2022 Barracuda Championship, 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- Would join Henrik Stenson (2016 Open Championship) as major championship winners from Sweden
- Would join the following European winners of the PGA Championship: Jim Barnes (1916, 1919), Padraig Harrington (2008), Martin Kaymer (2010), Rory McIlroy (2012, 2014)
- Would become the first international player to win the PGA Championship since Jason Day (2015)
- Would become the 15th international winner in the first 23 events this season

Miscellaneous Notes

- The largest come-from-behind win after 54 holes at the PGA Championship is seven shots (John Mahaffey/1978, Justin Thomas/2022)
- One week before his title defense at the Charles Schwab Challenge, **Davis Riley** (T3/-7) trails by four in bid for his first major championship title in eight starts (best finish: T13/2022 PGA Championship); previous-best 54-hole position in a major championship is T10 (2022 PGA Championship/T13)
- J.T. Poston (T3/-7) has yet to record a top-25 finish in 17 prior major championship starts; best finish in a major came at the 2024 Masters Tournament (T30)
- Jon Rahm (T5/-6) is five behind Scheffler in bid for third major championship title (2021 U.S. Open, 2023 Masters Tournament); eight players have won a Masters Tournament, U.S. Open and PGA Championship during their career, with Rory McIlroy the most recent to do so
- One day after recording the longest ace in major championship history (252 yards on No. 6), **Si Woo Kim** (T5/-6) cards an even-par 71 and trails by five; the last player to have an ace at a major championship and go on to win is David Toms at the 2001 PGA Championship at Atlanta Athletic Club (R3/No. 15)
- Jhonattan Vegas (T5/-6) records a third-round 73 to fall five behind Scheffler; would become the seventh player to carry the outright lead after the first and second rounds of a PGA Championship to victory (most recent: Xander Schauffele/2024)
