Major Championship notes

- Earns third major championship title in 23rd start (2022, 2024 Masters Tournament; 2025 PGA Championship)
- Becomes the 48th player with three or more major championships
- 15th player to win the Masters Tournament and PGA Championship during career (most recent: Rory McIlroy)
- Improves to 3-for-3 with the 54-hole lead at a major (2022, 2024 Masters Tournament; 2025 PGA Championship)
- Margin of victory in major championship wins: 2022 Masters (3), 2024 Masters (4), 2025 PGA Championship (5)
- Becomes the first player to win first three major championships by three or more strokes since Seve Ballesteros in 1983 (1979 Open Championship/won by 3, 1980 Masters Tournament/4, 1983 Masters Tournament/4)

PGA Championship notes

- Five-stroke win is the largest since Rory McIlroy won by eight in 2012
- Largest margins of victory: 8 (Rory McIlroy/2012), 7 (Jack Nicklaus/1980), 6 (Nick Price/1994), 5 (Davis Love III/1997, Tiger Woods/2006, Scheffler/2025)
- Is the 10th straight American winner (last international winner: Jason Day/2015)
- Earns fifth top-10 finish in six starts (T4/2020, T8/2021, MC/2022, T2/2023, T8/2024, 1st/2025)
- Records the 40th victory by a 54-hole leader/co-leader in PGA Championship history

PGA TOUR notes

- Earns his 15th PGA TOUR win in his 140th start at the age of 28 years, 10 months, 27 days
- Reigning FedExCup champion collects 750 points and moves from No. 4 to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- Joins Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods as the only players during the modern era to win 15 times on the PGA TOUR, including three majors, before the age of 29
- Shortest span between first and 15th PGA TOUR wins:
 - Woods (1996-1999; 3 years, 32 days)
 - Nicklaus (1962-1965; 3 years, 45 days)
 - Scheffler (2022-2025; 3 years, 94 days)
- Becomes the 65th player with 15 or more wins on the PGA TOUR; moves to T59 on the all-time wins list
- Becomes the sixth player to have won the Masters Tournament, PGA Championship and THE PLAYERS
 Championship during career, joining Jack Nicklaus, Raymond Floyd, Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson and Rory McIlroy
- Joins Tiger Woods as the only players to win consecutive TOUR starts by five or more strokes (since 1985):
 - Woods 2000 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (5), 2000 U.S. Open (15)
 - o Woods 2007 TOUR Championship (8), 2008 Farmers Insurance Open (8)
 - o Scheffler 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson (8), 2025 PGA Championship (5)
- First to win back-to-back starts since Rory McIlroy (2024 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2024 Truist Championship)
- Wins in back-to-back starts for the fourth time:
 - o 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship
 - 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship

- o 2024 Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage
- o 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament
- Joins Rory McIlroy and Sepp Straka as multiple winners this season
- Fourth consecutive season with multiple wins (2022/4; 2023/2; 2024/7; 2025/2)
- Improves to 10-for-16 when leading/co-leading entering the final round in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, having converted his last six

Miscellaneous Notes

- Two players have finished inside the top 10 at each of the first two majors:
 - Scottie Scheffler (4th/Masters Tournament, 1st/PGA Championship)
 - o **Bryson DeChambeau** (T5/Masters Tournament, T2/PGA Championship)
- One week before his title defense at the Charles Schwab Challenge, **Davis Riley** finishes T2 for his best finish in eight major championship starts (previous: T13/2022 PGA Championship)
- Harris English finishes T2 for his best finish in 33 major starts (previous-best: 3rd/2021 U.S. Open)
- 2022 and 2024 U.S. Open champion **Bryson DeChambeau** (T2) becomes the first player to finish runner-up in back-to-back PGA Championships since Dustin Johnson in 2020
- **Jhonattan Vegas** finishes T5 in bid to become the seventh player to carry the outright lead after the first and second rounds of a PGA Championship to victory
- Defending champion **Xander Schauffele** finishes T28, snapping a streak of 12 consecutive top-20 finishes in major championships; Brooks Koepka (2019) is the last player to successfully defend at the event
- 2025 Masters Tournament champion **Rory McIlroy** finishes T47 in bid to become the first player to win the Masters and PGA Championship in the same year since Jack Nicklaus (1975)
