# Ben Kohles (T1/-11) - CC

- Cards bogey-free 5-under 65 at Sawgrass Country Club for a share of the 54-hole lead
- Earned an exemption for Final Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry by virtue of his No. 145 finish in
  the 2025 FedExCup Fall standings; he will have conditional status on TOUR and full status on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2026
  should he finish outside the top five
- Finished No. 99 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall standings off the strength of a runner-up finish at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, where he made bogey on the 72nd hole and finished one stroke behind winner Taylor Pendrith
- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour graduate (2012, 2020-21, 2023) who finished No. 1 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- Four-time Korn Ferry Tour winner who recorded two-win seasons in 2012 and 2023, both of which culminated in PGA TOUR membership at season's end

## Marcelo Rozo (T1/-11) - CC

- Birdies three of the final four holes (par-3 15th, par-4 16th, par-4 17th) to card 5-under 65 at Sawgrass Country Club and earn a share of the 54-hole lead
- Seeking first PGA TOUR card in what is his 14th year as a professional (turned pro in 2012)
- Earned an exemption for Final Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry by virtue of his No. 45 finish on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List; he will have full status on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2026 should he finish outside the top five
- Previously finished No. 128 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and regained status for the 2025 season via a T43 finish
  at Final Stage of 2024 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry
- Also recorded top 75 finishes on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List in 2019 (No. 47) and 2022 (No. 62)
- Career-high finish on the Korn Ferry Tour is a runner-up finish at the 2019 Evans Scholars Invitational, where he lost to Scottie Scheffler in a playoff
- Three-time winner on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica with victories in 2013 (VISA Argentina Open presented by Macro), 2014, and 2018 (ECP Brazil Open)

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- Three players currently in the top five Marcelo Rozo (T1/-11), Cooper Dossey (T3/-10), A.J. Ewart (T3/-10) are bidding to earn PGA TOUR membership for the first time
- Cooper Dossey (T3/-10), who earned an exemption for Final Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry via a No. 44 finish on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, records one of two eagles on the par-5 11th at Sawgrass Country Club in the third round (Ryan Sullivan) en route to a 6-under 64
- A.J. Ewart (T3/-10), making his first appearance at Final Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, birdies two of the final three holes (par-4 16th, par-4 17th) and cards a 3-under 67 at Sawgrass Country Club; he advanced through Second Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry after a No. 15 finish on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Points List, which marked his second consecutive season on PGA TOUR Americas after four seasons at Barry University (2019-23), where he was recipient of the 2022 Jack Nicklaus Award as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year
- John Pak (T3/-10), who earned an exemption for Final Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry with a No. 152 finish in the 2025 FedExCup Fall standings as a PGA TOUR rookie, cards a 3-under 67 at Sawgrass Country Club; he previously earned TOUR membership for the first time with a No. 23 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (top 30 earned TOUR membership for 2025)
- Two-time Japan Golf Tour winner **Kota Kaneko** (T6/-9), one of five 36-hole co-leaders, cards 2-under 68 at Sawgrass Country Club and is one stroke out of the top five; he earned an exemption for Final Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry as the leading player from the 2025 Japan Golf Tour Order of Merit
- Spencer Levin (T6/-9), who finished No. 98 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and advanced through Second Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, cards the low round of the week at Sawgrass Country Club, a 7-under 63, to climb 31 places on the leaderboard and move within one stroke of the top five
- Mitchell Meissner (T17/-7), who finished No. 21 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (top 20 earned PGA TOUR membership for 2026), stands three strokes out of the top five after a 2-under 68 at Sawgrass Country Club; he is bidding to earn PGA TOUR membership for the first time
  - Meissner's younger brother, Mac Meissner, finished No. 85 in the 2025 FedExCup Fall standings in what was his second consecutive season on TOUR
- Marshall Meisel (T51/-3), who turned professional earlier this year after four seasons at Wake Forest University (2021-25), cards 5-under 65 for the low round of the day at the Dye's Valley Course and paces the five players who advanced through each stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, beginning at Pre-Qualifying

  - The first 25 finishers and ties in this category will be subject to the third reshuffle (occurs after 14th event –
     OccuNet Classic presented by Amarillo National Bank)
  - Any remaining finishers within the category will be subject to the second reshuffle (occurs after 10th event –
     Colonial Life Charity Classic)
  - All Remaining Finishers: Conditional membership for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Season and subject to the reshuffle (first reshuffle occurs after sixth event Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank); membership on PGA TOUR Americas for the 2026 season and subject to the reshuffle (first reshuffle occurs after sixth event Inter Rapidisimo Golf Championship)
