#### **Patton Kizzire**

- 2024 Procore Championship winner is set to make his ninth career appearance; had one top-10 finish prior to his victory (2<sup>nd</sup>/2016)
- Five-stroke win over David Lipsky is the largest margin of victory in tournament history
- Marked his third TOUR title and first since the 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii (a winless drought of 176 starts)
- Seeks his first top-10 result on TOUR since his win in Napa; best in 21 starts this season: T20/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic
- Enters the FedExCup Fall at No. 180 in the FedExCup Fall standings; exempt on TOUR thru 2026 following his victory at the 2024 Procore Championship

### **Scottie Scheffler**

- World No. 1 set to make his Procore Championship debut
- Has never won when making his first start at an event on TOUR; has seven top-five finishes in tournament debut
- 18-time TOUR winner seeks his first PGA TOUR victory in the state of California
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 19 starts this season, with a season-high 16 top-10 finishes (including 14 straight)
- Last finish outside the top 10 was THE PLAYERS Championship (T20)
- Leads all players with five wins this season: THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship, BMW Championship
- Became the first player since Tiger Woods (2005-07) to record five or more wins in back-to-back seasons

## Collin Morikawa

- Making his third career start at Procore Championship and first since 2020 (MC/2016, T10/2019)
- Owns four top-10s in 19 starts this season, including two runner-up finishes (The Sentry, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner with most recent victory at the 2023 Baycurrent Classic
- Played four seasons at Cal (2015-19), where he was a four-time All-American

## **Max Homa**

- Two-time Procore Championship winner (2021, 2022) set to make 10<sup>th</sup> start at the event
- Seeks to become the first three-time winner of the event (other multiple winner: Brendan Steele/2016, 2017)
- Enters the week No. 111 in the FedExCup Fall standings (exempt thru 2028)
- T5 at the John Deere Classic, his best finish and only top-10 in 20 starts this season
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner's most recent victory came at the 2023 Farmers Insurance Open

# **Procore Championship notes**

- Eleven of the top 25 players in the Official World Golf Ranking are in the field
- 12 players in the field have won a tournament this season, including multiple winners **Scottie Scheffler** (5), **Brian Campbell** (2) and **Ben Griffin** (2)
- 12 players in the field competed at last month's TOUR Championship, including seven that finished in the top 10: Patrick Cantlay (T2), Russell Henley (T2), Scottie Scheffler (T4), Cameron Young (T4), Sam Burns (T7), Justin Thomas (T7), Ben Griffin (T10)
- Four 2024 FedExCup Fall winners qualified for the 2025 FedExCup Playoffs (bold= in the field): Kevin Yu/Sanderson Farms
  Championship, J.T. Poston/Shriners Children's Open, Nico Echavarria/Baycurrent Classic, Maverick McNealy/The RSM
  Classic
- Five past champions in the field: Emiliano Grillo (2015), Cameron Champ (2019), Max Homa (2021,2022), Sahith Theegala (2023), Patton Kizzire (2024)
- Making his fifth career Procore Championship appearance and first since 2020, **Patrick Cantlay** is the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings (T2) without a victory on TOUR this season; eight-time PGA TOUR winner's last victory came at the 2022 BMW Championship
- The United States Walker Cup team members **Ethan Fang** and **Jackson Koivun** enter the week off a 17-9 victory over Great Britain and Ireland at 50th Walker Cup at Cypress Point; Koivun the No. 1-ranked amateur will make his seventh start this season and has back-to-back top-10 finishes (T6/ISCO Championship, T5/Wyndham Championship); qualified for the Procore Championship via his T5 finish at the Wyndham Championship
- Sponsor exemption Justin Hastings will make his sixth start of the season (best: T13/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld)
- 16-year-old **Miles Russell** will make his fourth career PGA TOUR start as a sponsor exemption in search of his first made cut; Ranked No. 15 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking, Russell claimed his second career title at the AJGA's Junior PLAYERS Championship at TPC Sawgrass on Aug. 31

## **Ryder Cup**

- Following the Procore Championship, the FedExCup Fall will take a two-week hiatus, during which the 45th Ryder Cup (Sept. 23-28) will be contested at Bethpage State Park's Black Course in Farmingdale, New York
  - 10 of the 12 United States Ryder Cup Team players will be in Napa: Sam Burns, Patrick Cantlay, Harris English, Ben Griffin, Russell Henley, Collin Morikawa, Scottie Scheffler, J.J. Spaun, Justin Thomas, Cameron Young
  - While not in the field, United States Ryder Cup Captain and eight-time PGA TOUR winner Keegan Bradley will be on site to support
  - United States Ryder Cup Vice Captains in the field: Webb Simpson, Brandt Snedeker, Gary Woodland

### **PGA TOUR season notes**

- The 2025 Procore Championship is the first of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2026) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
- The Aon Next 10 is an eligibility pathway that awards access into Signature Events (outside of The Sentry), recognizing the top 10 players, not otherwise exempt, from the FedExCup standings; Nos. 51-60 in the final FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will serve as the Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
- Notable players who begin the FedExCup Fall around the top 100 in the standings and are not exempt beyond 2025 (**bold** = in the field): Rasmus Højgaard (No. 85), **Michael Thorbjornsen** (No. 88), **Joel Dahmen** (No. 93), **Taylor Moore** (No. 100), Alex Noren (No. 105), **Harry Higgs** (No. 112), **Matt Kuchar** (No. 127) and **Adam Hadwin** (No. 136)
