## Mackenzie Hughes (1st/-9)

- Seventh 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-6 converting to victory (2016 RSM Classic)
- Second outright 18-hole lead this season (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic/finished P2)
- 9-under 63 ties his low round of the season (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic/R1)
- Lowest 18-hole score in 25 career rounds in the Procore Championship (previous best: 66, two times, R3/2024, R1/2018)
- Totaled 11 birdies, the most in a single round in his TOUR career (767 total rounds); previous best was 10 (two times, 2024 Sentry/R4/finished T25, 2020 Travelers Championship/R1/finished T3)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.151)
- In seven prior starts in the Procore Championship, owns three top-25 finishes (T4/2024, T25/2023, T13/2017)
- Entered the week 65<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup Fall standings after logging three top-10 finishes in 23 starts this year (10<sup>th</sup>/Texas Children's Houston Open, T3/RBC Heritage, P2/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner (2016 RSM Classic, 2022 Sanderson Farms Championship)

## **Miscellaneous Notes**

- Matt McCarty (T2/-8) posts a bogey-free 64, tied for his second-lowest round on TOUR in his 29<sup>th</sup> career start (best: 62/R1/2024 Bank of Utah Championship/Won); sits solo-second, the best 18-hole position of his PGA TOUR career
- In his 105<sup>th</sup> career start, **Ben Griffin** (T2/-8) opens with a bogey-free 64, tied for his career low first-round score; ten top-10 finishes this season, tied with **Russell Henley** (T4/-7) for second most by any player (most: 16, Scottie Scheffler)
- Making his ninth PGA TOUR start and seventh this season, amateur Jackson Koivun (T7/-5) sits inside the top 10 after 18 holes for the first time; seeks third consecutive top-10 finish (T6/2025 ISCO Championship, T5/2025 Wyndham Championship)
- Scottie Scheffler (T38/-2) cards a 2-under 70, snapping his streak of 21 consecutive rounds in the 60s; tied with Patrick Cantlay (2021-22) for the longest such streak since 1983 (21/Cantlay/2021-22, 21/Scheffler/2025, 19/Viktor Hovland/2019-20, 17/Bob Estes/2003, 17/Taylor Montgomery/2023-24)
- Two-time Procore Championship winner **Max Homa** (T51/-1) bids to become the event's first three-time winner (2021, 2022)
- Defending champion **Patton Kizzire** (T67/E) seeks to join Homa and Brendan Steele (2018, 2019) as the only players to successfully defend their title at the Procore Championship
- Opening-round scores of Ryder Cup players in the field:

- The 2025 Procore Championship is the first event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- At the conclusion of the final FedExCup Fall event (The RSM Classic), players inside the top 100 of the FedExCup Fall Points List will secure exempt status for 2026, while players finishing between Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status
- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2026 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational)
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2027) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
