Weather: Partly cloudy. High of 79. Wind S 6-12 mph, gusting to 16 mph.

36-hole cut: 70 professionals and two amateurs at 1-under 143 from a field of 140 professionals and four amateurs

Ben Griffin (1st/-14)

- One of two players bogey-free through 36 holes (J.J. Spaun)
- Fourth 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-3 to date (2023 Sanderson Farms Championship/T2, 2025 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday/2nd, 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge/Won)
- Three-stroke lead is one shy of 36-hole tournament-record four-stroke lead (John Mallinger/2012)
- Making his 105th start, seeking his third TOUR win: 2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Andrew Novak), 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge; would join Scottie Scheffler (5) and Rory McIlroy (3) as the only players with three or more victories this season
- 130 total is one stroke shy of his best opening 36-hole scores on TOUR (129/2025 Charles Schwab Challenge/Won, 129/2022 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T3)
- In 28 starts this season has notched 10 top-10 finishes, tied with Russell Henley for second most by any player (most: 16, Scottie Scheffler)
- Making his second appearance at the Procore Championship (MC/2022)
- Leads the field in Approach Shot Proximity: 24 feet, 5 inches
- After playing the par-5 holes in 5-under through two rounds, now 316-under on par-5 holes since the start of the 2024 PGA TOUR season, the most of any player during that period; next best: Harry Hall (270), Scottie Scheffler (269)

Jackson Koivun (T2/-11)

- Making his ninth PGA TOUR start, seventh this season and first at the Procore Championship
- No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking and one of four amateurs in the field this week, seeks third consecutive top-10 finish (T6/2025 ISCO Championship, T5/2025 Wyndham Championship)
- Has shot 68 or better in his last nine rounds on TOUR
- Prior to this week, nine amateurs had competed in the Procore Championship with Luke Clanton (T50/2024) posting the best finish by an amateur in tournament history
- Auburn University junior earned PGA TOUR membership via PGA TOUR University Accelerated at the conclusion of stroke play at the 2025 NCAA Championship, finishing T4 in stroke play to earn the final point needed to reach the 20-point threshold in the program

Miscellaneous Notes

- Three U.S. Ryder Cup team rookies sit among players at T4 or better (Ben Griffin, Russell Henley, J.J. Spaun)
- The 10 U.S. Ryder Cup team members in the field have combined for a total of 98 birdies and one eagle (**Patrick Cantlay**/No. 18/R2)

- With rounds of 65-68, **Russell Henley** (T2/-11) cards 16 birdies, the most of any player through 36 holes; five of his 10 rounds at Silverado Resort are in the 60s
- 36-hole scores of Ryder Cup players in the field:

- 2025 U.S. Open winner **J.J. Spaun** (T4/-9) owns five top-three finishes this season, including playoff losses at THE PLAYERS Championship (Rory McIlroy) and the FedEx St. Jude Championship (Justin Rose); five top-three finishes are second-most this season, behind only Scottie Scheffler (8); joins Ben Griffin as the only two players in the field to go bogey-free through 36 holes
- 2019 Texas Children's Houston Open winner **Lanto Griffin** (T4/-9) entered this week at No. 142 in the FedExCup Fall standings; lone top-10 result in 23 starts this season: T9/Farmers Insurance Open
- After making a career-best 11 birdies in an opening-round 63, first-round leader **Mackenzie Hughes** (T7/-7) cards zero birdies for a 2-over 74 in the second round
- In his first appearance at the Procore Championship, **Scottie Scheffler** (T13/-6) seeks his sixth victory this season and his first in California; a top-10 finish would mark his 15th consecutive; owns 16 top-10s in 19 starts this season
- Two-time Procore Championship winner **Max Homa** (T26/-4) bids to become the event's first three-time winner (2021, 2022); defending champion **Patton Kizzire** (+1) misses the cut

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The 2025 Procore Championship is the first event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- At the conclusion of the final FedExCup Fall event (The RSM Classic), players inside the top 100 of the FedExCup Fall Points List will secure exempt status for 2026, while players finishing between Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status
- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2026 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational)
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2027) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
