Ben Griffin (1st/-16)

- Seeks third PGA TOUR title in his 105th start at the age of 29 years, 4 months, 8 days
- PGA TOUR victories (2): 2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Andrew Novak), 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Would join Scottie Scheffler (5) and Rory McIlroy (3) as the only players with three or more victories this season
- Fourth 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR; 1-for-3 to date
 - 2022 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T3
 - 2023 Sanderson Farms Championship/T2
 - 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge/Won
- Held the 54-hole lead in the Zurich Classic of New Orleans en route to winning with teammate Andrew Novak
- Has 10 top-10 finishes in 28 starts this season, tied with Russell Henley for second most (16/Scottie Scheffler)
- Making his second appearance at the Procore Championship (MC/2022)
- After playing the par-5 holes in 5-under through three rounds, 316-under on par-5 holes since the start of the 2024 PGA TOUR season, the most of any player during that period; next best: Scottie Scheffler (272-under)

Jackson Koivun (2nd/-15)

- No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking seeks first PGA TOUR victory in his ninth start
- Seeks to become the fourth amateur to win on TOUR (since 1983) and first since Nick Dunlap (2024 American Express)
- Best finish by an amateur on TOUR this season: T4/Kieron van Wyk/Puerto Rico Open
- Best finish by an amateur at Procore Championship: T50/Luke Clanton/2024
- Enters the week with consecutive top-10 finishes (T6/2025 ISCO Championship, T5/2025 Wyndham Championship)
- Has shot 68 or better in his last 10 rounds on TOUR
- Auburn University junior earned PGA TOUR membership via PGA TOUR University Accelerated at the conclusion of stroke play at the 2025 NCAA Championship, finishing T4 in stroke play to earn the final point needed to reach the 20-point threshold in the program

Scottie Scheffler (3rd/-14)

- World No. 1 seeks 19th PGA TOUR win and sixth this season in his 150th start
- Leads all players with five wins this season: THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship, BMW Championship
- Would mark his first professional victory in the state of California
- Currently T46 on the all-time wins list with 18, tied with Julius Boros, Jim Ferrier, Dutch Harrison and Nick Price
- Win would come in his Procore Championship debut; has never won when making his first start at an event on TOUR
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 19 starts this season, with a season-high 16 top-10 finishes (including 14 straight)
- Leads the field in birdies (20), Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (10.362) and Proximity (24'4")

Miscellaneous Notes

- Making his fourth start at the Procore Championship, South Africa's **Garrick Higgo** (4th/-13) seeks third PGA TOUR victory and second this season (2021 Palmetto Championship at Congaree, 2025 Corales Puntacana Championship); leads the field in Driving Distance (309.3)
- Scores of Ryder Cup players in the field thru 54 holes:

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The 2025 Procore Championship is the first event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- At the conclusion of the final FedExCup Fall event (The RSM Classic), players inside the top 100 of the FedExCup Fall Points List will secure exempt status for 2026, while players finishing between Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status
- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2026 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational)
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2027) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
