Scottie Scheffler (Winner/-19)

- Earns 19th PGA TOUR win and sixth this season in his 150th career start at the age of 29 years, 2 months, 24 days
- World No. 1 leads all players with six wins this season: THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship, BMW Championship, Procore Championship
- Second consecutive season with at least six wins (2024/7, 2025/6), joining Tiger Woods (1999/8, 2000/9, 2005/6, 2006/8, 2007/7, 2009/6) as the only two players since 1983 to record 6+ wins in multiple seasons
- Moves to T40 on the all-time wins list with 19; tied with Ben Crenshaw, Ernie Els, Doug Ford, Hubert Green, Tom Kite and Bill Mehlhorn
- Win comes in his Procore Championship debut; first time winning in his debut at an event on TOUR and his first professional
 win in the state of California
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 20 starts this season, with a season-high 17 top-10 finishes (including 15 straight); last finish outside the top 10: THE PLAYERS Championship (T20)
- Led the field in birdies (26), Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (14.508), Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (8.797) and Proximity (25'0")
- Entered the final round two shots back from 54-hole leader Ben Griffin; fifth career win overcoming at least a two-shot deficit after 54 holes (2025 BMW Championship/four-shot deficit, 2024 PLAYERS Championship/five-shot deficit, 2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/two-shot deficit, 2022 WM Phoenix Open/two-shot deficit)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Ben Griffin** (2nd/-18) records his 11th top-10 finish of the season, second most by any player only behind Scottie Scheffler (17); marks his fourth runner-up finish on TOUR and second this season (2025 Procore Championship/2nd, 2025 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday/2nd, 2024 RBC Canadian Open/2nd, 2023 Sanderson Farms Championship/PT2); entered the day as the solo 54-hole leader and opened the final round with birdies on his first three holes before playing the final 15 holes at 1-over par
- Lanto Griffin (3rd/-17) records the low round of the day with a 7-under 65, his second 65 this week (R1); led all players this week in Strokes Gained: Putting (8.943) and earns his best finish on TOUR since winning the 2019 Texas Children's Houston Open; projected to climb from 142nd to 100th in the FedExCup Fall standings
- Emiliano Grillo (T4/-16) birdies his final three holes to earn his second top-10 finish of the season (P2/John Deere Classic)
- Amateur Jackson Koivun (T4/-16) records the best finish by an amateur in Procore Championship history (previous best: T50/Nick Dunlap/2024); No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking records third consecutive top-10 finish on TOUR (T6/2025 ISCO Championship, T5/2025 Wyndham Championship)

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The 2025 Procore Championship is the first event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season
- At the conclusion of the final FedExCup Fall event (The RSM Classic), players inside the top 100 of the FedExCup Fall Points List will secure exempt status for 2026, while players finishing between Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status
- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2026 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational)
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the similar benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2027) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship and PGA Championship
