Thorbjørn Olesen (T1/-9)

- Holds 18-hole lead/co-lead for the second time on TOUR (2017 PGA Championship/T44)
- Marks the second time he has held the lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR
- Matches his career-low 18-hole score on TOUR with a 9-under 61 (R4/2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
- With co-leader Cristobal Del Solar, now shares the lowest opening-round score in RBC Canadian Open history (61)
- Best finish in 10 starts this season: T5/Valero Texas Open
- Eight-time DP World Tour winner seeks to become the first player from Denmark to win on the PGA TOUR
- Owns one top-3 finish in 88 PGA TOUR starts (T3/2018 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational)
- Won the 2016 ISPS HANDA World Cup with fellow Dane Soren Kjeldsen

Cristobal Del Solar (T1/-9)

- Chilean was 10-under through 16 holes, including four birdies in a row (Nos. 9-12), his longest consecutive birdie streak on TOUR, before finishing bogey, par for 9-under 61
- Holds 18-hole lead/co-lead for the first time on TOUR (previous best position through 18 holes: T3/2024 Mexico Open at VidantaWorld/finished T48)
- Was attempting to become the first player to post sub-60 rounds on both the PGA TOUR and Korn Ferry Tour; recorded the lowest 18-hole score in the history of PGA TOUR-sanctioned events with a 13-under 57 in the first round of the 2024 Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard on the Korn Ferry Tour
- With a win at The Ascendant presented by Blue in 2024, finished No. 14 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn PGA TOUR membership for 2025
- Four-time winner on PGA TOUR Latinoamerica, with victories in each of the following years: 2018, 2019, 2022, 2023

Additional Notes

- Three-time TOUR winner Cameron Champ (3rd/-8) has missed the cut in four prior appearances at this event
- **Jake Knapp** (4th/-7) makes third appearance at this event (70th/2019, MC/2023); shot 59 in the first round of the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches en route to T6, his best finish in an individual stroke-play event this season
- Shane Lowry (T5/-6) seeks his fourth PGA TOUR title in his 199th start on TOUR; made five cuts in six appearances at the RBC Canadian Open, including two top-10 finishes (T2/2019, T10/2022)
- Defending champion **Robert MacIntyre** (T9/-5) cards his lowest opening round score this season and fifth consecutive round in the 60s at the RBC Canadian Open
- Mackenzie Hughes (T43/-2) holes a 194-yard approach for eagle on No. 5, the longest hole-out of his PGA TOUR career
- Luke Clanton (T96/E), David Ford (T96/E) and Gordon Sargent (T119/+1) each made their first starts as PGA TOUR members after gaining access via the PGA TOUR University program
- 2019 and 2022 RBC Canadian Open winner **Rory McIlroy** (T119/+1) equals his highest opening round in five appearances at this event (71/R1/2023)
- Mike Weir's (T119/+1) 32 consecutive appearances is a record for most consecutive starts at the RBC Canadian Open
- Seamus Power withdrew during the first round with an injury
