## Cameron Champ (1<sup>st</sup>/-12)

- Bogey-free through 36 holes for the first time in his 159<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR and the only player bogey-free through 36 holes
- 128 marks his lowest 36-hole total on TOUR (previous 130/2023 Shriners Children's Open)
- Tied career low round score in first round (62/R2/2018 World Wide Technology Championship)
- Holds third 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR, 1-for-2 converting to victory (T18/2023 Shriners Children's Open, Won/2018 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Three-time TOUR winner, looking to secure first victory since 2021 3M Open
- Best finish in five starts on TOUR this season: T15/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson
- Marks first made cut in fifth appearance at the RBC Canadian Open
- Was the eighth alternate when commitments closed on the Friday deadline and joined the field Tuesday after RBC Ambassador Sahith Theegala withdrew due to injury

## **Additional Notes**

- Andrew Putnam (2<sup>nd</sup>/-10) cards low round of the day (62); ties career low round (five times: R4/2023 World Wide Technology Championship, R3/2023 Sony Open in Hawaii, R2/2022 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, R1/2019 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- 18-hole co-leader **Thorbjørn Olesen** (T3/-9) cards even par 70; looks to become first player from Denmark to win on the PGA TOUR
- Canadian **Richard Lee** (T3/-9) makes the cut for the first time at this event in his fourth appearance (MC/2024, 2019, 2009); carded bogey-free second round 64 in his first start on TOUR since the 2021 Open Championship
- 2023 champion **Nick Taylor** (T3/-9) seeks his second TOUR title this season (Won/Sony Open in Hawaii); looks to become the second multiple winner of this event since Rory McIlroy
- Victor Perez (T3/-9) sets career low 36-hole total (131) after carding second round 65 (previous best: 133/2024 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches)
- Three qualifying spots are available for the 153<sup>rd</sup> Open at Royal Portrush through the Open Qualifying Series; the leading three finishers, not otherwise exempt, from the RBC Canadian Open will earns spots in the field; through 36 holes the leading non-exempt players are Cameron Champ (1<sup>st</sup>/-12), Andrew Putnam (2<sup>nd</sup>/-10), with Richard Lee and Victor Perez tied for third at 9 under
- Luke Clanton, David Ford and Gordon Sargent all finish at 1 under 139 to miss the cut in their first starts as PGA TOUR members after gaining access via the PGA TOUR University program
- 2019 and 2022 RBC Canadian Open winner **Rory McIroy** (MC/+9) misses the cut for the first time since the 2024 Open Championship and cards his highest round in a non-major since the 2021 PLAYERS Championship (79/R1)
- Camilo Villegas withdrew before the second round and Isaiah Salinda withdrew during the second round
