Aldrich Potgieter (1st/-19)

- Five consecutive birdies (Nos. 4-8) ties his longest consecutive birdie streak on TOUR
- First time recording two rounds of 7-under or better in the same event on the PGA TOUR (62/R1, 65/R3)
- First-round co-leader holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for second time on TOUR (2025 Mexico Open in VidantaWorld/P2)
- 54-hole leaders/co-leaders have won 15 of 27 stroke-play events this season, most recent: Ryan Fox/RBC Canadian Open
- South African looks to become second international winner of the Rocket Classic (Cam Davis/Australia/2021 and 2024)
- At 20 years, 9 months, 16 days on Sunday, would become the seventh-youngest PGA TOUR winner since the start of 1983
- Would become the youngest PGA TOUR winner from South Africa since 1983; previous: Garrick Higgo/ 22 years, 1 month, 1 day/2021 Palmetto Championship at Congaree
- Youngest 2025 PGA TOUR member would become the second rookie to win on TOUR this season (Karl Vilips/Puerto Rico Open)
