Aldrich Potgieter (Winner/-22)

- Earns first PGA TOUR title in 20th start at 20 years, 9 months, 16 days with 17-foot, 10-inch birdie putt on the fifth playoff hole (par-3 15th) to become the seventh-youngest PGA TOUR winner since the start of the 1983 season
- Wins longest playoff on TOUR since 2021 BMW Championship (Patrick Cantlay def. Bryson DeChambeau/six holes)
- Youngest PGA TOUR winner from South Africa since 1983; previous: Garrick Higgo/ 22 years, 1 month, 1 day/2021 Palmetto Championship at Congaree
- Third PGA TOUR winner under the age of 21 since the start of the 2020-21 season (Nick Dunlap/2024 American Express, 2024 Barracuda Championship; Tom Kim/2022 Wyndham Championship, 2022 Shriners Children's Open)
- Ninth first-time winner on TOUR this season, second TOUR rookie to win this season (Karl Vilips/Puerto Rico Open), and third player to make the Rocket Classic his first PGA TOUR victory (Nate Lashley/2019, Cam Davis/2021)
- Earns 500 FedExCup Points and moves from No. 73 to No. 36 in the FedExCup standings
- Improves to 1-for-2 converting 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory on TOUR (2025 Mexico Open in VidantaWorld/P2)
- 54-hole leaders/co-leaders have won 16 of 28 stroke-play events this season
- Converts first 18-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR into victory; 18-hole leaders/co-leaders have won four of 28 stroke-play events this season (Justin Thomas/RBC Heritage, Scottie Scheffler/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, J.J. Spaun/U.S. Open)
- South African becomes second international winner of the Rocket Classic (Cam Davis/Australia/2021 and 2024)
- Rocket Classic is the 16th of 29 PGA TOUR events this season won by an international player
- Earned PGA TOUR membership with a No. 29 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (top 30 earned TOUR membership); second-youngest graduate in Korn Ferry Tour history at 19 years, 11 months, 23 days; won the 2024 The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club at 19 years, 4 months, 11 days and became the youngest winner in Korn Ferry Tour history

Additional Notes

- Three players ties the largest playoff of the 2025 PGA TOUR season (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic/Ryan Fox defeated Mackenzie Hughes and Harry Higgs); previous two playoffs at the Rocket Classic also featured three players (2021/Cam Davis def. Troy Merritt and Joaquin Niemann; 2023/Rickie Fowler def. Adam Hadwin and Collin Morikawa)
- Max Greyserman (P2/-22) records fourth runner-up finish in 47th start on TOUR (2024 3M Open, 2024 Wyndham Championship, 2024 Baycurrent Classic, 2025 Rocket Classic), falls to 0-1 in playoffs; played the back nine bogey-free and a cumulative 14-under par in regulation, including birdies at the par-4 16th and par-5 17th in the final round
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner **Chris Kirk** (P2/-22) falls to 1-1 in playoffs (2023 Congizant Classic in The Palm Beaches/defeated Eric Cole), records his first top-five finish on TOUR since winning the 2024 Sentry
- **Michael Thorbjornsen** (T4/-21), who finished No. 1 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking, birdies three of final five holes of regulation (Nos. 14, 16, 17) to earn his third top-five finish of the season (Corales Puntacana Championship/T2, Zurich Classic of New Orleans/T4)
- PGA TOUR winner Jake Knapp (T4/-21), who carded a tournament-record 11-under 61 in the second round, posts his best result of the season in an individual stroke-play event (previous: Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches/T6)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Nico Echavarria** (T6/-20) closes in 6-under 66 to earn his second top-10 finish of the season (Sony Open in Hawaii/P2)
- PGA TOUR rookie Jackson Suber (T6/-20) records his second top-10 finish in his 19th start on TOUR (Sony Open in Hawaii/T6)
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner **Collin Morikawa** (T8/-19), the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 5 in the Official World Golf Ranking, records his second top-10 in as many appearances at the Rocket Classic (P2/2023)
- PGA TOUR winner Andrew Putnam (T8/-19) records top-10 finishes in consecutive starts (RBC Canadian Open/T6) for the first time since 2021 (Puerto Rico Open/T5, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/T4)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Thriston Lawrence** (T8/-19) records his second top-10 finish in his 28th start on TOUR (2024 Open Championship/4th)
- Kevin Roy (T8/-19) posts his second top-10 finish of the season (Puerto Rico Open/T6); entered 2025 with one top-10 finish in 32 starts on TOUR (2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship/T8)
- With a 3-under 69, PGA TOUR winner **Harry Hall** (T13/-18) extends his consecutive rounds in the 60s streak to 10, the longest active streak on TOUR; 27 of last 28 rounds on TOUR are par or better (72/R2/PGA Championship)
- Will Gordon (T51/-10), who made the cut on the number to maintain status on the PGA TOUR in what was his last start on a major medical extension, follows three consecutive 3-under 69s with final-round 1-under 71
