Playoff Notes

- This was the 16th playoff in Sony Open in Hawaii history and sixth in the last 10 years
- First playoff this season (first since Kevin Yu def. Beau Hossler at the 2024 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- Playoff records:
 - Nick Taylor: 3-0
 - Nico Echavarria: 0-1

Nick Taylor (P1/-16)

- Earns fifth PGA TOUR win in his 284th start at the age of 36 years, 8 months, 29 days; previous wins: 2024 WM Phoenix Open, 2023 RBC Canadian Open, 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2015 Sanderson Farms Championship
- Improves to 3-0 in playoffs on TOUR; each of his last three wins came in a playoff
- Third consecutive season with a PGA TOUR victory
- Canadian becomes the 11th international player (12th win) to win the Sony Open in Hawaii; previous instance: Si Woo Kim/2023
- Becomes the fifth player in the last six years of the Sony Open in Hawaii to come from behind to win in the final round
- Victory comes in his ninth appearance at the Sony Open in Hawaii; previous best finish: T7/2023 and 2024
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (8.232)
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings
- Fully exempt on TOUR through the 2027 season

Nico Echavarria (P2/-16)

- Earns his fourth top-two finish on TOUR in 63 starts; previous instances: Won/2024 Baycurrent Classic, Won/2023 Puerto Rico Open, T2/2024 RSM Classic
- Third top-two finish in his last six starts on TOUR
- Moves to No. 5 in the FedExCup standings

Miscellaneous Notes

- 54-hole leader **J.J. Spaun** finishes T3 at 15-under after closing with 68; falls to 1-for-4 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead; matches his low 72-hole score on TOUR (265; sixth instance overall; most recent: 2024 Wyndham Championship/T3)
- **Stephan Jaeger** finishes T3 at 15-under; his fifth top-three finish on TOUR in 153 starts
- Seeking his first PGA TOUR win, **Eric Cole** finishes fifth at 14-under; finishes T1 in birdies for the week (23/Lee Hodges)
- Making his first start as a PGA TOUR rookie, **Jackson Suber** finishes T6 at 13-under

- The Sony Open in Hawaii, the second event of the 2025 PGA TOUR Season and first Full-Field event, was the first opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5.
- The Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5 are eligibility pathways for players, not already qualified, to play their way into Signature Events via the FedExCup standings.
- The top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earn the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open will qualify for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, while the top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points during those three events and the WM Phoenix Open, will qualify for The Genesis Invitational.
- The Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational was determined through the 2024 FedExCup Fall standings.
