Notable

- A professional tee was added to No. 16 since last year.
- Ahead of last year's tournament No. 17 green was moved 30 yards further back and two bunkers were added to the left of the green.
- January was extremely cold and included 3-4" of snowfall.
- Weather since last year's event included a May windstorm (a derecho) that damaged more than 100 trees and then Hurricane Beryl in July which dropped 13"-plus of rain and damaged 100 more trees.
- Half of maintenance staff has more than 20 years of experience at Memorial Park while the other half has 2.5 years or less of experience at the course.

• The public golf course is extremely busy, and the biggest challenge Henry and staff face is balancing the daily maintenance operation with the extra tasks that are required for this tournament without impacting play too much.
