## Scottie Scheffler (1st/-23) - with the 54-hole lead/co-lead

- Holds an eight-stroke lead with a 54-hole total of 23-under 190
- Eight-stroke 54-hole lead is the largest on the PGA TOUR since Rory McIlroy at the 2011 U.S. Open (8/Won)
- 10th opening 54-hole score of 190 or better in PGA TOUR history

#### Scheffler - with a victory

- World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup champion seeks his 14th win in his 139th start at age of 28 years, 10 months, 13 days
- Win would be first of the season and first official victory since 2024 TOUR Championship (won 2024 Hero World Challenge)
- With a win, would become the 72nd player to reach 14 wins on the PGA TOUR and move to T65 on the all-time wins list
- Would be his fourth consecutive season with a win (four wins in 2022; two wins in 2023; seven wins in 2024)
- Would be second TOUR victory in his home state of Texas (2022 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- Would become first wire-to-wire winner on TOUR since Lee Hodges (2023 3M Open) and third in tournament history
   Wire-to-wire winners at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson:
  - o Mark Hayes (1976)
  - Tom Watson (1980)
- 28-year-old Dallas resident making sixth start at the event (best finish: T5/2023)
- Made his PGA TOUR debut at 2014 CJ CUP Byron Nelson as a 17-year-old amateur and finished T22
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (15.033), Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (9.413)
- Entered the week No. 4 in the FedExCup standings; has finished in the top 25 in each of his eight starts this season (best: T2/Texas Children's Houston Open)

#### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- South Africa's Erik van Rooyen (T2/-15) seeks his third PGA TOUR victory in his 127th start (2021 Barracuda Championship, 2023 World Wide Technology Championship); would become the third player from South Africa to win THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, joining Ernie Els/1995 and Rory Sabbatini/2009 (later changed nationality to Slovakia)
- Adam Schenk (T2/-15) cards a third-round 65 and trails by eight; entered the week off six missed cuts and made his fifth cut in his 13<sup>th</sup> start this season (best: T6/Sony Open in Hawaii)
- PGA TOUR rookie and former University of Florida standout **Ricky Castillo** (T2/-15) seeks first PGA TOUR victory in 15<sup>th</sup> start (best: T12/2025 Valspar Championship)
- Aon Swing 5: The top five FedExCup points earners from the Corales Puntacana Championship, Zurich Classic of New Orleans, and THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson will earn spots in next week's Truist Championship via the Aon Swing 5.
