Today – A complex of thunderstorms is moving across the Red River to our north early this morning. A few t-storms are along the tail of this system that may move into the area around 7:30AM if they can hold together. Otherwise, showers and thunderstorms will become more likely towards late morning into the early afternoon as a cold front slowly moves to the south. Storms could be strong with gusty winds and small hail. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be possible through late afternoon before improving
