Today – Sprinkles will be possible this morning. Otherwise, mostly cloudy skies can be expected into the afternoon with temperatures warming into the low 80s. It will be breezy with gusts to 25 mph. Severe thunderstorms are expected to develop ahead of a cold front and dryline across W. Texas this afternoon. This activity is expected to approach the DFW later this evening with the possibility of strong winds and heavy rainfall.

Extended forecast – Showers and thunderstorms will be likely Wednesday and could be severe, especially during the afternoon and evening. Strong winds, hail, heavy rain and isolated tornadoes can be expected with flooding possible. This activity will shift off to the east Wednesday night with cooler and drier weather returning Thursday. Another chance for showers and a few thunderstorms moves through Friday morning as the cold front finally moves through before drying out Friday afternoon. High pressure tries to build south into North Texas this weekend pushing the t-storm threat to our south.
