Patrick Rodgers (1st/-8)

- Hit 14 of 18 greens in regulation en route to a 4-under 68; made a final-hole bogey after hitting his third shot into the water
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke play events for the fifth time on TOUR; also held 54-hole lead at 2023
 Barracuda Championship (Stableford scoring); 0-for-5 to date converting to victory
- First career 54-hole lead came at Torrey Pines at the 2017 Farmers Insurance Open (finished T4)
- In nine appearances at The Genesis Invitational has three top-25 finishes (T12/2021, T15/2019, T22/2017)
- Seeks first PGA TOUR victory in his 287th start at age 32; all six winners on TOUR this season were in their 30s
- Owns four runner-up results on TOUR: most recent, 2023 Barracuda Championship (lost playoff to Akshay Bhatia)
- Earned a spot in the two Signature Events following The Sentry via the Aon Next 10 after finishing No. 53 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall (T22/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Won the 2015 Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard on the Korn Ferry Tour, defeating Steve Marino in a playoff

Miscellaneous Notes

- First-round leader **Denny McCarthy** (2nd/-7) seeks first PGA TOUR victory in his 194th start; owns a pair of runner-up finishes: 2024 Valero Texas Open (lost in playoff to Akshay Bhatia) and 2023 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (lost in playoff to Viktor Hovland)
- Ludvig Åberg (3rd/-6) collects his first hole-in-one on the PGA TOUR with a 140-yard pitching wedge at hole No. 3; with each ace this week, Genesis makes a \$10,000 donation to California Rises; all six aces on the PGA TOUR this season have come from international players; last player to make an ace and go on to win: Rory McIlroy/2025 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am
- **Tony Finau** (T4/-4) chips in three times on the front nine en route to a 5-under 67; owns two runner-up results at The Genesis Invitational, including a playoff loss to Max Homa in 2021 (T2/2018); leads the field in total birdies (15)
- Patrick Cantlay (T4/-4) owns three top-five finishes at The Genesis Invitational, including his last two appearances (T4/2024, 3rd/2023, T4/2018)
- Seven-time DP World Tour winner Tommy Fleetwood (T4/-4) continues to search for his first PGA TOUR title in his 147th start
- 36-hole leader **Davis Thompson** (T4/-4) cards a first-hole birdie plus five additional bogeys to fall four strokes back
- Rory McIlroy (T8/-3) won the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am in his season debut, capturing his 27th PGA TOUR title; a victory this week would mark his sixth time winning in back-to-back starts on TOUR since 1983, surpassing Vijay Singh (5) for second-most, but eight shy of Tiger Woods (14)
- Scottie Scheffler's (T8/-3) 4-over 76 marks his highest round on TOUR since 2022 PLAYERS Championship (76/+4/R4), a span of 212 official rounds; second over-par round this season (72/+1/R4/2025 WM Phoenix Open)
- Defending champion Hideki Matsuyama's (T13/-2) 4-under 68 marks his first under-par round this week
