**Ludvig Åberg (Won/-12)**

- Earns his second PGA TOUR title in his 40<sup>th</sup> career start at the age of 25 years, 3 months, 17 days
- Recorded a final-round 66 including eight birdies against two bogeys
- Played final six holes 4-under par with four birdies (Nos. 13, 14, 15, 18)
- 455 days since his last victory (2023 RSM Classic)
- Totaled 19 birdies and two eagles (R2/No. 18, R3/No. 3) this week; led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (10.0)
- Recorded a hole-in-one in the third round (No. 3, 140 yards), the first ace of his TOUR career; one of two players this season to record an ace and go on to win (Rory McIlroy/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am); also becomes the first player since 1983 to record an ace in an event at Torrey Pines (South) and go on to win
- Opened the week with a first-round 74, the highest first-round score by any winner of The Genesis Invitational since 1983
- A native of Sweden, Åberg becomes the sixth international winner in the first seven events this season: Thomas Detry (Belgium), Rory McIlroy (Northern Ireland), Sepp Straka (Austria), Nick Taylor (Canada), Hideki Matsuyama (Japan)
- Becomes the 13<sup>th</sup> international player, and fourth consecutive, to win The Genesis Invitational (first from Sweden)
- Earns 700 FedExCup points and moves to No. 1 in the 2025 FedExCup standings
- Projected to move from No. 6 to No. 4 in the Official World Golf Ranking

**Miscellaneous Notes**

- **Maverick McNealy** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-11) recorded the low round of the week with a final-round 64; sat 9-under par through 13 holes of the final round prior to playing the last five holes 1-over; records third runner-up finish on TOUR in his 148<sup>th</sup> career start (2<sup>nd</sup>/2021 Procore Championship, 2<sup>nd</sup>/2021 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- 54-hole leader **Patrick Rodgers** (T3/-9) cards a final-round 71 and clinches his first top-10 finish this season, his best finish on TOUR since the 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship (T3)
- **Scottie Scheffler** (T3/-9) follows his third-round 76 with a final-round 66 to notch his second top-10 in three starts this season (T9/WM Phoenix Open); marks third top-10 in seven starts at The Genesis Invitational (T10/2024, T7/2022)
- **Patrick Cantlay** (T5/-8) finishes inside the top five at The Genesis Invitational for the third consecutive year and the fourth time in 10 career starts in the event (T4/2024, 3<sup>rd</sup>/2023, T4/2018)
- **Tony Finau** (T5/-8) recorded 20 birdies this week, tied with McNealy for the most in the field
- **Denny McCarthy** (T5/-8) led all players this week with three eagles (R1/No. 18, R2/No. 6, R4/No. 6)
- Defending champion **Hideki Matsuyama** finishes T13 following a final-round 70
- Three players recorded bogey-free rounds Sunday: **Akshay Bhatia** (T9/-6), **Daniel Berger** (12<sup>th</sup>/-5) and **Lucas Glover** (T31/-1)
- **Keegan Bradley** (T34/E) records a hole-in-one on hole No. 3, marking the third ace of his career (2020 Workday Charity Open, 2014 American Express); with each ace this week Genesis makes a \$10,000 donation to California Rises
