AON SWING 5

The Aon Swing 5 for the Memorial Tournament is made up of the top five FedExCup points earners, not otherwise exempt, from the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic and Charles Schwab Challenge. All five players in the Aon Swing 5 had a top-three finish at those two events:

Matti Schmid	Runner-up at the Charles Schwab Challenge (and T7/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
Ryan Fox	Winner of the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic
Bud Cauley	Solo-third at the Charles Schwab Challenge
Harry Higgs	Lost in a playoff at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic (and T59/Charles Schwab Challenge)
Mackenzie Hughes	Lost in a playoff at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic

Fox, Higgs and Schmid are making their first start in a Signature Event in 2025. Brandt Snedeker (sponsor exemption) is also making his first appearance in a Signature Event this season.

TOP 50 RETENTION TRACKING

28 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 of the current season's standings through the Charles Schwab Challenge. At No. 5, Ben Griffin is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024 (No. 57 in 2024).

For reference:

- » Through the 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge, 32 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings were in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- » 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.

ELIGIBILITY NOTES

Tournament host exemption

The Memorial Tournament's tournament host exemption is reserved for the winner of the Jack Nicklaus Award as the NCAA Division I Player of the Year. With the NCAA Championship set to conclude Wednesday and the Memorial Tournament one week earlier on the schedule than it was in 2024, the winner of the 2025 Jack Nicklaus Award will earn an exemption to the 2026 Memorial Tournament. The winner will be announced on Sunday, June 1.

Three of the five finalists for the award have earned a PGA TOUR card through PGA TOUR University (*): Luke Clanton* (Florida State), David Ford* (North Carolina) Jackson Koivun* (Auburn), Michael La Sasso (Ole Miss) and Christiaan Maas (Texas).

Player-hosted Signature Event

As one of three player-hosted Signature Events, the Memorial Tournament features three modifications:

- 36-hole cut to the low 50 players (and ties) and any additional players within 10 strokes of the 36-hole lead
- A redistribution of the purse, including \$4 million to the winner
- Three-year PGA TOUR exemption available to the winner

These two modifications were also in effect at The Genesis Invitational and Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard.
