Nick Taylor (T1/-7)

- 68 ties his low score (R1/2021) and first bogey free in 18 career rounds at Muirfield Village
- Third 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-2 converting the victory (2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- T27 in 2024 marks his best result in five career appearances at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Two top-10s in 14 starts this season, including his fifth career PGA TOUR title at the Sony Open in Hawaii
- Sits second in the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (4.005); entered the week 92nd in Strokes Gained: Putting this season (.045)
- Seeks to become the fifth multiple winner of the 2025 PGA TOUR Season; entering the week, the last three winners on TOUR claimed their second title of the season (Sepp Straka/Truist Championship, Scottie Scheffler/PGA Championship, Ben Griffin/Charles Schwab Challenge)

Ben Griffin (T1/-7)

- Third career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-2 converting the victory (2025 Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Second player to earn multiple 36-hole leads/co-leads this season (Scottie Scheffler/Texas Children's Houston Open, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- First player to hold at least a share of the 36-hole lead in back-to-back weeks on TOUR since Nico Echavarria (2024 Baycurrent Classic, 2024 World Wide Technology Championship)
- Entered the week coming off his first individual PGA TOUR victory at last week's Charles Schwab Challenge; seeks to become the first player to win in back-to-back weeks on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters Tournament, 2024 RBC Heritage)
- Making his third career start in the Memorial Tournament (2024/MC, 2023/MC)

Additional Player Notes

- Akshay Bhatia (3rd/-5) has 11 birdies through two rounds, tied for the most in the field (Xander Schauffele); has three top-10s in 14 starts this season, but none since a season-best T3 at THE PLAYERS Championship; seeks to become the first left-handed player to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- Defending champion and World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (4th/-4) opens with under-par scores in the first two rounds for the third time in his fifth tournament appearance (67-68/2024/Won, 67-71/2021/3rd); has sat T5 or better through 36 holes in six of his 12 starts on TOUR this season
- **Jordan Spieth** (T5/-3) birdies three of his final four holes for a 69 for his best position through 36 holes on TOUR since the 2025 WM Phoenix Open (T4/finished T4); three top-10s in 12 career tournament appearances entering the week (T3/2015, T5/2023, T7/2019)
- Sam Burns (T5/-3) posts 65 for the low round of the day and his first score in the 60s in 18 career rounds at Muirfield Village Golf Club
- Shane Lowry (T5/-3) owns four top-10s this season, with three coming in Signature Events (2nd/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T2/Truist Championship, 7th/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard); one top-10 at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday in eight starts (T6/2021)
