Scottie Scheffler (1st/-8)

- Cards his first bogey-free round at the Memorial Tournament (19 rounds)
- With a win, would join Tiger Woods (1999-2001) as the only players to successfully defend their title at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- World No. 1, reigning FedExCup champion and 15-time PGA TOUR winner in search of third victory of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship)
- 2024 champion became the fourth winner of the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday to go on to win the FedExCup in the same season, including the third in the last four years (Viktor Hovland/2023, Patrick Cantlay/2021, Tiger Woods/2009)
- Making his fifth career tournament appearance (Won/2024, 3rd/2023, 3rd/2021, T22/2020)
- With a win, following his 2025 PGA Championship victory, would join Tiger Woods as the only players to win the Memorial Tournament and THE PLAYERS Championship or a major championship in the same season in multiple years: Scheffler (2024), Woods (1999, 2000, 2001)
- Holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the 17th time; is 10-for-16 to date when leading/co-leading entering the final round in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, having converted his last six

Ben Griffin (2nd/-7)

- Entered the week coming off his first individual PGA TOUR victory at last week's Charles Schwab Challenge; seeks to become the first player to win in back-to-back weeks on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters Tournament, 2024 RBC Heritage)
- Last player to win Charles Schwab Challenge and the Memorial Tournament in consecutive weeks: Kenny Perry (2003)
- With a win, would join Scottie Scheffler (2021-22) and Jimmy Walker (2013-14) as players who have won their first three PGA TOUR titles in the same season in the ShotLink era (since 2003)
- Bogey at No. 9 marks his lone bogey on the front nine, which he has played 7-under through 54 holes
- Making his third career start in the Memorial Tournament (2024/MC, 2023/MC)

Additional Player Notes

- Final pairing in Sunday's final round features **Scottie Scheffler** (PGA Championship) and **Ben Griffin** (Charles Schwab Challenge), the two most recent winners on TOUR
- At 5-over on his round through 13 holes, second-round co-leader **Nick Taylor** (3rd/-5) holes a 118-yard approach for eagle at No. 14; seeks to become the fifth multiple winner of the 2025 PGA TOUR Season; entering the week, the last three winners on TOUR claimed their second title of the season (Sepp Straka/Truist Championship, Scottie Scheffler/PGA Championship, Ben Griffin/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- **Sepp Straka** (T4/-3) cards bogey-free 66, his low score in 21 career rounds at Muirfield Village; recorded six birdies in a round for the second consecutive day (R2/73)
- U.S. Ryder Cup team captain **Keegan Bradley** (T4/-3) birdies four of his last five holes to card a 4-under 68; a pair of T8 finishes (2015, 2016) mark his best results in 14 prior appearances at the Memorial Tournament
- Playing on a sponsor exemption, Jordan Spieth (T4/-3) seeks his first win on TOUR since the 2022 RBC
 Heritage; owns three top-10 results in 12 starts at the Memorial Tournament (T3/2015, T7/2019, T5/2023)
- A third victory at the Memorial Tournament for **Patrick Cantlay** (T7/-2), who won in 2019 and 2021, would see him join Kenny Perry (1991, 2003, 2008) with the second-most in tournament history, behind Tiger Woods (1999, 2000, 2001, 2009, 2012)
- One qualifying spot is available for The Open Championship in July and will go to the leading player, not otherwise exempt; through 54 holes the leading three non-exempt players are Rickie Fowler (T7/-2), Jacob Bridgeman (T10/-1), Ryan Gerard (T15/+1)

Scottie Scheffler (1st/-8)

- Cards his first bogey-free round at the Memorial Tournament (19 rounds)
- With a win, would join Tiger Woods (1999-2001) as the only players to successfully defend their title at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- World No. 1, reigning FedExCup champion and 15-time PGA TOUR winner in search of third victory of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship)
- 2024 champion became the fourth winner of the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday to go on to win the FedExCup in the same season, including the third in the last four years (Viktor Hovland/2023, Patrick Cantlay/2021, Tiger Woods/2009)
- Making his fifth career tournament appearance (Won/2024, 3rd/2023, 3rd/2021, T22/2020)
- With a win, following his 2025 PGA Championship victory, would join Tiger Woods as the only players to win the Memorial Tournament and THE PLAYERS Championship or a major championship in the same season in multiple years: Scheffler (2024), Woods (1999, 2000, 2001)
- Holds the 54-hole lead/co-lead for the 17th time; is 10-for-16 to date when leading/co-leading entering the final round in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, having converted his last six

Ben Griffin (2nd/-7)

- Entered the week coming off his first individual PGA TOUR victory at last week's Charles Schwab Challenge; seeks to become the first player to win in back-to-back weeks on TOUR since Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters Tournament, 2024 RBC Heritage)
- Last player to win Charles Schwab Challenge and the Memorial Tournament in consecutive weeks: Kenny Perry (2003)
- With a win, would join Scottie Scheffler (2021-22) and Jimmy Walker (2013-14) as players who have won their first three PGA TOUR titles in the same season in the ShotLink era (since 2003)
- Bogey at No. 9 marks his lone bogey on the front nine, which he has played 7-under through 54 holes
- Making his third career start in the Memorial Tournament (2024/MC, 2023/MC)

- Final pairing in Sunday's final round features **Scottie Scheffler** (PGA Championship) and **Ben Griffin** (Charles Schwab Challenge), the two most recent winners on TOUR
- At 5-over on his round through 13 holes, second-round co-leader **Nick Taylor** (3rd/-5) holes a 118-yard approach for eagle at No. 14; seeks to become the fifth multiple winner of the 2025 PGA TOUR Season; entering the week, the last three winners on TOUR claimed their second title of the season (Sepp Straka/Truist Championship, Scottie Scheffler/PGA Championship, Ben Griffin/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- **Sepp Straka** (T4/-3) cards bogey-free 66, his low score in 21 career rounds at Muirfield Village; recorded six birdies in a round for the second consecutive day (R2/73)
- U.S. Ryder Cup team captain **Keegan Bradley** (T4/-3) birdies four of his last five holes to card a 4-under 68; a pair of T8 finishes (2015, 2016) mark his best results in 14 prior appearances at the Memorial Tournament
- Playing on a sponsor exemption, Jordan Spieth (T4/-3) seeks his first win on TOUR since the 2022 RBC
 Heritage; owns three top-10 results in 12 starts at the Memorial Tournament (T3/2015, T7/2019, T5/2023)
- A third victory at the Memorial Tournament for **Patrick Cantlay** (T7/-2), who won in 2019 and 2021, would see him join Kenny Perry (1991, 2003, 2008) with the second-most in tournament history, behind Tiger Woods (1999, 2000, 2001, 2009, 2012)
- One qualifying spot is available for The Open Championship in July and will go to the leading player, not otherwise exempt; through 54 holes the leading three non-exempt players are Rickie Fowler (T7/-2), Jacob Bridgeman (T10/-1), Ryan Gerard (T15/+1)
