Scottie Scheffler (Won/-17) PGA TOUR Notes

- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader picks up his 17th PGA TOUR win in his 146th start at the age of 29 years, 29 days
- Moves to T50 on the all-time wins list, tied with Bobby Cruickshank, Jim Furyk, Harold McSpaden and Curtis Strange
- Collects 750 points and retains the No. 1 spot in the FedExCup rankings
- TOUR-best fourth win of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship)
- Third season with four or more wins (2022/4, 2024/7, 2025/4)
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 16 starts this season, with a season-high 13 top-10 finishes (including 11 straight)

Open Championship Notes

- Record 12th consecutive first-time Open Championship winner; Ernie Els in 2012 became the most recent multiple winner
- With rounds of 68-64-67-68, becomes the seventh Open Championship winner to record four rounds in the 60s (first since Collin Morikawa/2021)
- Becomes the second reigning top-ranked player (fourth win) in the Official World Golf Ranking to win The Open Championship (Tiger Woods/2000, 2005, 2006)
- Fourth player since 2014 to win The Open Championship after entering the week inside the top five in the Official World Golf Ranking (Scottie Scheffler/2025/No. 1, Xander Schauffele/2024/No. 3, Collin Morikawa/2021/No. 4, Jordan Spieth/2017/No. 3)

Major Championship Notes

- 31st player with four or more major championship victories (2022 Masters Tournament, 2024 Masters Tournament, 2025 PGA Championship, 2025 Open Championship); win comes in his 25th start in a major and is his 16th top-10 finish
- Ninth player to win the Masters Tournament, PGA Championship and Open Championship in their career (second this season: Rory McIlroy)
- 20th player to win the PGA Championship and Open Championship in their career; seventh player to do so in the same season (eighth occurrence; first since Xander Schauffele/2024)
- Becomes the first player during the modern major championship era to win his first four majors by three or more strokes: 2022 Masters (3), 2024 Masters (4), 2025 PGA Championship (5), 2025 Open Championship (4)
- 267 is a personal-best 72-hole score in a major championship (previous: 270/2020 PGA Championship/T4)
- Only player with top-10s in all four majors of 2025 (4th/Masters Tournament, 1st/PGA Championship, T7/U.S. Open, 1st/The Open Championship)

54-Hole Leader Notes

- Improves to 12-for-18 when leading/co-leading entering the final round in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, having converted the last eight
- Wins for the 10th straight time when carrying the outright lead into the final round

• Improves to 4-for-4 in major championships when holding the 54-hole lead

Additional Player Notes

- First-round co-leader **Harris English** (2nd) finishes runner-up in two of the last three major championships this season, both to Scheffler (PGA Championship/T2, The Open Championship/2nd)
- 2025 Genesis Scottish Open champion **Chris Gotterup** finishes third in bid to become the first player to win on TOUR and win a major the following week since Rory McIlroy in 2014
- With scores of 76-66-66-65, 2023 U.S. Open champion **Wyndham Clark** (T4) picks up his second top-10 finish in 16 major championship starts
- 2022 U.S. Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick finishes T4 in effort to become the 20th player to win The Open and the U.S. Open during their career (most recent: Jordan Spieth/2017); making his 10th start at The Open Championship, best finishes have both come at Royal Portrush (T4/2025, T20/2019)
- In his sixth appearance at The Open Championship, **Haotong Li** finishes T4; a third-place finish in his debut appearance at the 2017 Open Championship remains the best finish on the PGA TOUR by a player from China
- 2025 Masters Tournament champion and World No. 2 **Rory McIlroy** finishes T7 in bid to become the first player to win the Masters and Open Championship in the same year since Tiger Woods in 2005
- Xander Schauffele finishes T7 in title defense; has finished no lower than T28 (2025 PGA Championship) in 15 consecutive major championships, dating to a T13 at the 2022 PGA Championship; now has 26 top-20 finishes in 34 major championship starts
- Shane Lowry, winner of the 2019 Open Championship at Royal Portrush, finishes T40
