Sami Valimaki (Winner/-23) – PL-SS-SS-SS

- Earns his first PGA TOUR title in his 54th career start at the age of 27 years, 4 months, 7 days
- Converts first career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR into one-stroke victory over Max McGreevy
- Becomes 17th first-time winner on TOUR this season and fourth of the FedExCup Fall
- Becomes the 11th player to win first career TOUR title at The RSM Classic and fifth consecutive, joining Talor Gooch (2021), Adam Svensson (2022), Ludvig Åberg (2023) and Maverick McNealy (2024)
- Becomes first player from Finland to win on the PGA TOUR
- Becomes the fourth international winner in tournament history, joining Mackenzie Hughes (2016/Canada), Adam Svensson (2022/Canada) and Ludvig Åberg (2023/Sweden)
- Previous best finishes on TOUR: 2nd/2024 Mexico Open at Vidanta, T2/2025 World Wide Technology Championship
- Becomes sixth player to win in his tournament debut and first since Austin Cook in 2017
- Records career-low 72-hole score (259) and 54-hole score (193)
- Projected to move from No. 98 to No. 40 in the Official World Golf Ranking, his career-high rank and first time inside the top 50
- With the victory, earns a two-year PGA TOUR exemption, 500 FedExCup points, and invitations to THE PLAYERS Championship, RBC Heritage and PGA Championship in 2026
- Moves from No. 74 in the FedExCup Fall standings to No. 51 and qualifies for two Signature Events in 2026 via the Aon Next 10 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational)

Additional Player Notes

- **Max McGreevy** (2nd/-22) earns his second career runner-up (2022 Puerto Rico Open) and moves to No. 60 FedExCup Fall standings
- PGA TOUR rookie **Ricky Castillo** (3rd/-21) cards his 18-hole low score of 8-under 62 during the final round (previous: 64/R1/2025 RBC Canadian Open) to finish a career-best solo-third in his 31st career start (previous: T5/2025 THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Sponsor exemption **Johnny KEEFER** (T7/-18), who finished No. 1 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, records first top-10 finish in sixth start on TOUR
- With a T7 finish in his 10th appearance at The RSM Classic, **Patrick Rodgers** (T7/-18) records his 30th top-10 finish, tying Byeong Hun An (30) for the most top-10 finishes on TOUR without a win (since 1983 and among active players)
- **Sam Stevens** (T7/-18) aced the par-3 third hole from 196 yards during the final round, his first hole-in-one on TOUR and the second ace on No. 3 at the Seaside Course (other: Mark Anderson/2014/R1)

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The RSM Classic was the final event of the FedExCup Fall to determine the Top 100, players who will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season

- No players moved inside the top 100 following The RSM Classic
- The Aon Next 10 is an eligibility pathway that awards access into Signature Events, recognizing the top 10 players, not otherwise exempt, from the FedExCup standings; Nos. 51-60 in the standings qualify for two Signature Events in 2026 via The Next 10 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
 - Three players moved into the Aon Next 10: **Sami Valimaki** (Won/No. 74 to No. 51), **Nico Echavarria** (T4/No. 62 to No. 55), **Max McGreevy** (2nd/No. 89 to No. 60)
 - Three players fell out of the Aon Next 10: **Jordan Spieth** (DNP/No. 58 to No. 61), **Jake Knapp** (DNP/No. 59 to No. 63), **Kevin Yu** (DNP/No. 60 to No. 64)
